**THIRTY SIXTH ANNUAL SPORTS MEET 2003 - 2004 REPORT**

Distinguished Chief Guest of the Thirty Sixth Annual Sports Meet, C.Sylendra Babu, I.P.S., Asst. Commissioner of Police, Venerable Chairman, Respected Secretary and Members of the Managing Committee, dear Principal and colleagues and my dear students.

It is once again a great privilege this afternoon to present a brief report of the major activities of games and sports of the year, at this 36<sup>th</sup> sports meet. For the last 15 years, our players have been ranked first or second in the number of university players, right from 1987 onwards. As in the past, this year also, our players and athletes excelled in participation and won laurels at the inter collegiate, University, State National and International levels..

As in the last year, this year also the chess players of the college won international recognition when J.E.Kavitha of III B.A Literature participated in the 26<sup>th</sup> Asian Junior Chess Championship at Sri Lanka on 25<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> July 2003. J.E.Kavitha represented Tamilnadu state at the junior National Chess Championship held at Vijayawada from 27<sup>th</sup> September to 5<sup>th</sup> October 2003. Kavitha was again selected to participate in the G.A.C.C. World Inter University Chess Tournament at Kuala Lumpur from 24<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2003 at Malaysia representing the Madras University.

Further at the Women Chess Tournament at Calicut from 31<sup>st</sup> May to 5<sup>th</sup> June 2003, C.V.Rajalakshmi won the 11<sup>th</sup> place scoring 6.5 points out of total 9 points. E.K.Aksharalakshmi of II B.C.S. Secured 8<sup>th</sup> place at the T.I. Cycles State Chess Championship on 5<sup>th</sup> & 6<sup>th</sup> July 2003. At the National 'A' Chess Tournament at Calicut from 9<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> November 2003, C.V.Rajalakshmi won the 18<sup>th</sup> position. In the Rating tournament held at Lucknow from 17<sup>th</sup> to 25<sup>th</sup> September 2003, Rajalakshmi was placed third in the women's list. The College Chess team again won the intercollegiate Chess Tournament at JBAS College in September 2003. At the Inter-Zone tournament conducted at the University Union on 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> September, the college emerged winners. C.V.Rajalakshmi, J.E.Kavitha along with V.Thavamani of III B.Com., were selected to play for the University and they secured first three places at the all India Inter-University Chess Tournament held at Saurashtra University from 24<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> January 2004. C.V.Rajalakshmi won I<sup>st</sup> place with a cash award of Rs. 4,000/- at the Rachel Paramjothi Chess Tournament conducted by Ethiraj College.

The Cricket Players had their field day this year. The winning spree was in motion during the Bhatt Memorial tournament in our college grounds from 28<sup>th</sup> July to 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2003, when the college cricket team won the match. At the state meet at Chidambaram our college cricketers played representing the Kanchipuram District on 22<sup>nd</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup> & 24<sup>th</sup> October 2003. They are Dhivya Rabindar of I MSW, V.Sudarsana of III B.Sc. Physics, S.Subha of III B.Sc. S.Komala of II B.Com., E.Jayashree of II B.Sc., Physics & V.Krithika of II Comp. Sci. at the state meet, Dhivya Rabindar & V.Krithika were selected for the state camp from 2<sup>nd</sup> September to 20<sup>th</sup> September 2003, to play the nationals. V.Krithika played the south zone inter state tournaments at Ananthapur as member of the Tamilnadu Women's cricket team.

At the Inter-collegiate cricket Tournament conducted by the University of Madras at

Let me finish this brief report extending my sincere thanks to the guests of honour at this function Mr.MathiSekaran and Mr.Sylendra Babu. Finally let me wind up congratulating all the prize winners at this thirty sixth sports meet. Participation is a reward in itself as true sportsmanship is the basis for our contest. As such for those who put in their best and lost, I wish them better luck next time in the true Olympic Spirit.

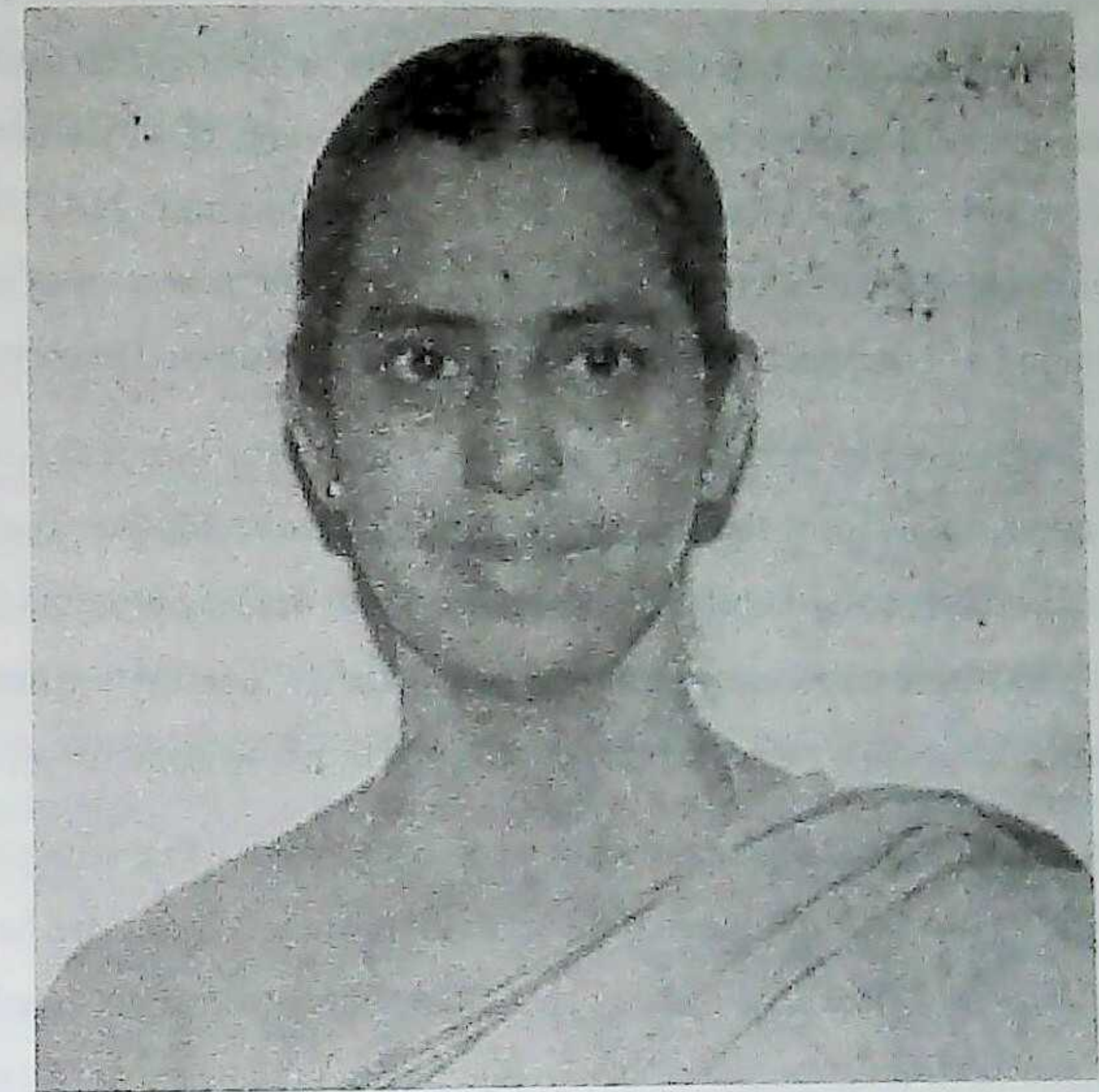
Last but not the least we have sold 5012 Friendship bands. We are indeed proud to say that we have sold the maximum number of hands. The money from it goes to an orphanage.

- Wish I could ever do it!

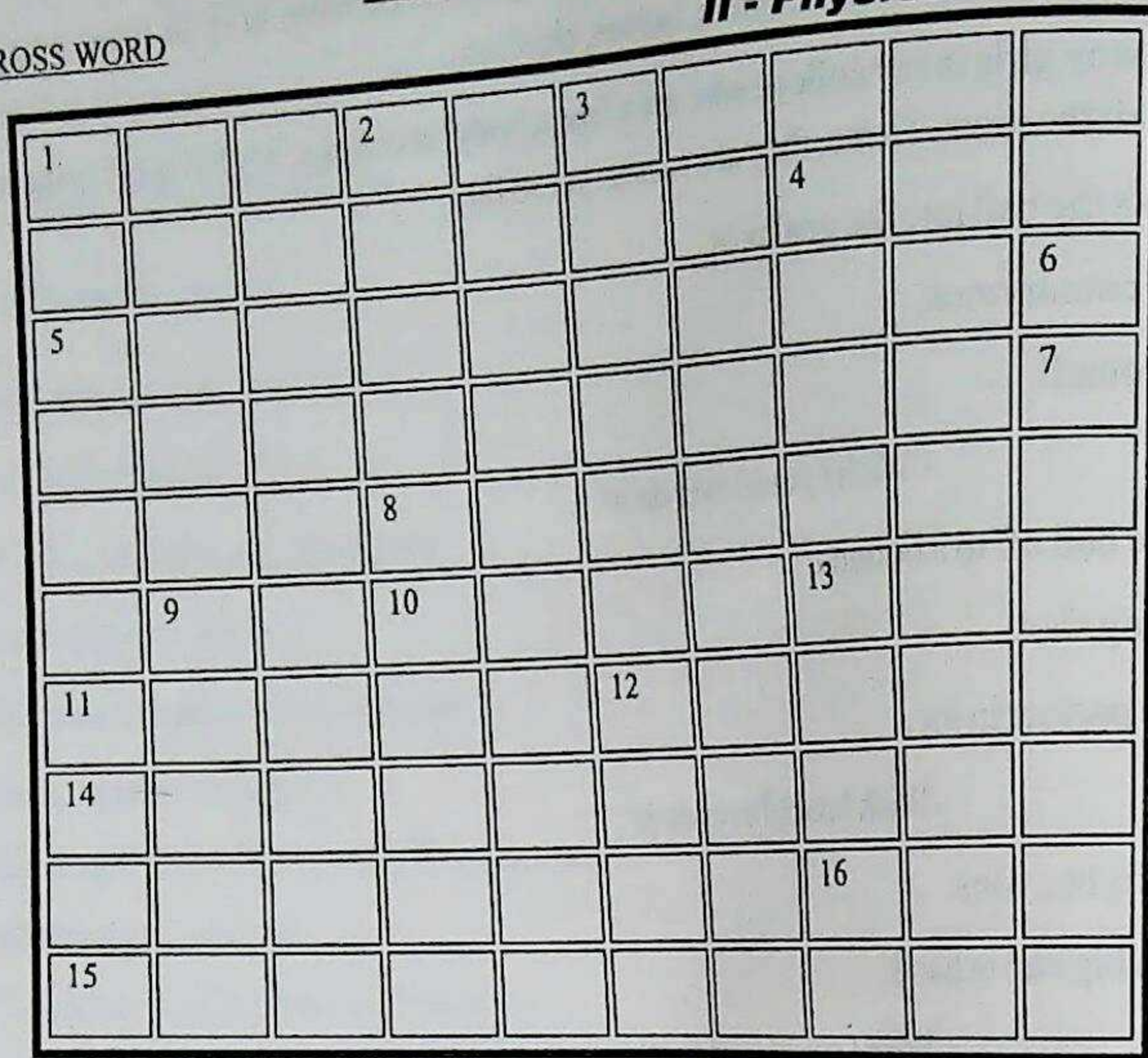
All I can do is cheer my team. Because I am born to be a spectator. Out of the one billion in our country, a very few privileged belong to the former and the rest fall in line with me.

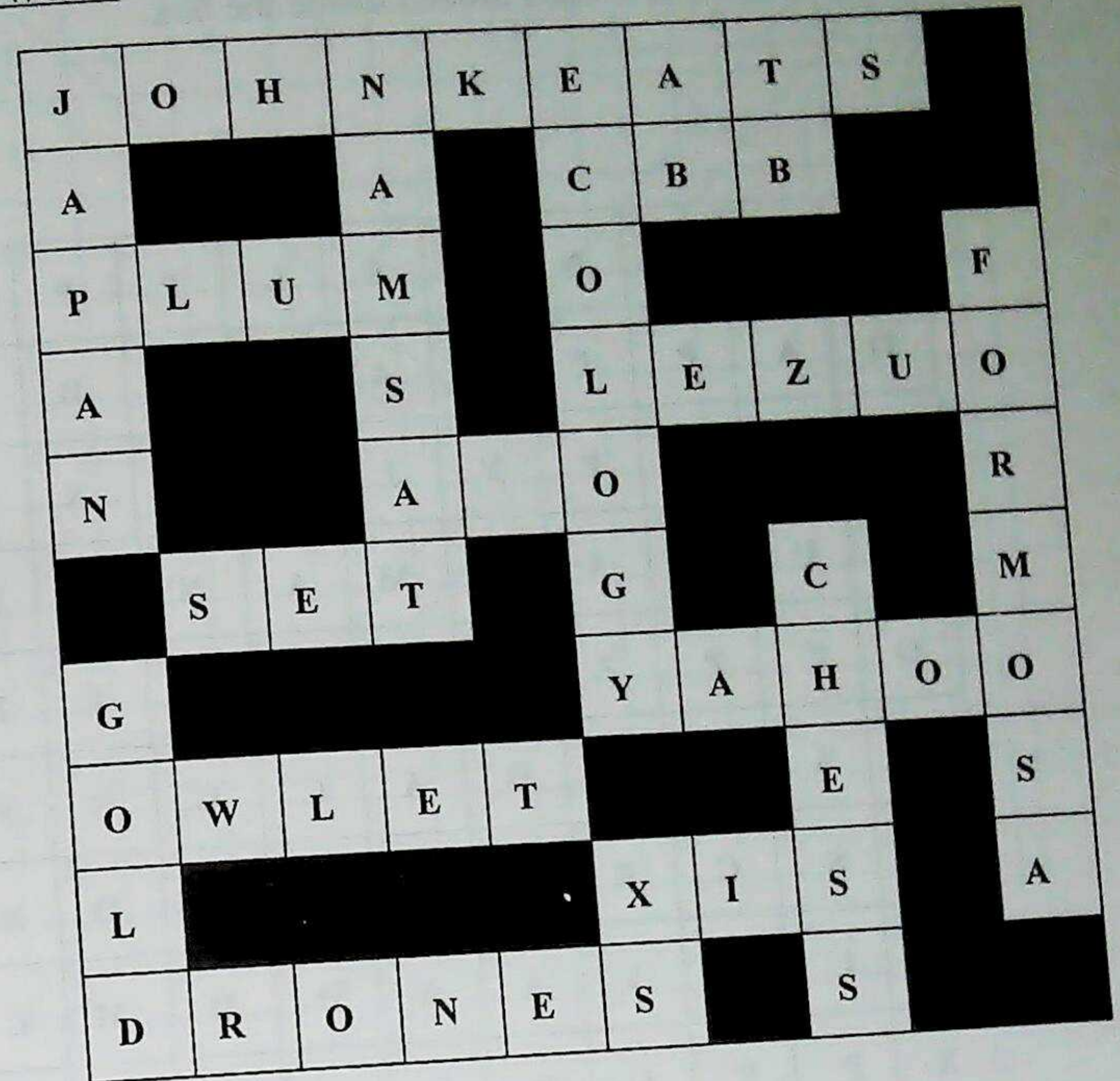

Instead, he whacked the ball again and again until it became pitted and nicked. The nicks and cuts held air closer to the flying ball, and the more the clergyman hit his **gultie**, the better it flew, soon soaring farther than any feathery. Every duffer Wanted to use the long flying, battered balls, and manufactures made dimpled gulties by the thousands.

Now, golfers include graphite clubs and scientifically tested balls with 300-500 dimples each. I wonder whether the Romans or even that determined Scottish clergyman would recognise THEIR game today!!

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## உரிமையும் கடமையும்

### முன்னுரை

இன்றைய சூழ்நிலையில் பெரியவர், சிறியவர், ஆண், பெண், உயர்ந்தோர், தாழ்ந்தோர் என அனைவரும் அறிந்து கொள்ள வேண்டியது தத்தம் உரிமையும் கடமையும். ஆகும். ஆனால் தொழிலாளர்கள் தங்களை அதிகாரம் செய்யக் கூடாதென்று நினைக்கின்றனர். மூத்த குடிமக்கள் தங்களை யாரும் மதிப்பதில்லை என்று குமுறுகின்றனர். குழந்தைகள் தம் பெற்றோர்களை கட்டுப்பாட்டினை விரும்புவதில்லை.

### உரிமை என்றால் என்ன?

"எந்த ஒரு மனிதனும் பெற்றிருக்க வேண்டிய ஒரேயொரு உரிமை என்னவெனில் எப்போதும் அவன் தன்னுடைய கடமையை ஆற்றக்கூடிய உரிமையாகும்" - "லியான் டக்யுட்"

"உரிமை என்பது அங்கீகரிக்கப்பட்ட / சட்டத்தால் பாதுகாக்கப்பட்ட ஆர்வமுள்ள, அனுசூலமான ஒரு கேட்பு (Claim) அல்லது ஒரு சலுகை (Privilege) ஆகும்". - "சர் ஜான் சால்மண்ட்"

இவ்விரு அறிஞர்களின் கருத்துகளும் உரிமை என்றால் என்னவென்று தெளிவாக விளக்குகின்றன.

### கடமை என்றால் என்ன?

ஒரு குடிமகன் சட்டபூர்வமாகவோ அல்லது மனசாட்சிப்படியோ ஆற்ற வேண்டிய வேலைகள் கடமை என்றால் அது மிகையல்ல.

ஒருவன் ஆற்றக்கூடிய கடமைகள் மூலம் (சேவை மற்றும் தியாகம்) உலகின் மிகப்பெரிய உரிமைகள் எட்டப்படுகின்றன - பிரேம் சந்த். "கடமையைச் செய் பலனை எதிர்பாராதே" - பகவத்கீதை. "கடமை கண்ணியம் கட்டுப்பாடு" - அறிஞர் அண்ணா. மேற்கூறிய கருத்துகள் கடமை என்றால் என்னவென்று விளம்புகின்றன.

### உரிமைக்கும் கடமைக்கும் உள்ள தொடர்பு

(அ) உரிமையும் கடமையும் ஒரு சிறிய நூலிழையினால் மட்டுமே பிரிக்கப்பட்டுள்ளது. உரிமையும் கடமையும் ஒன்றோடொன்று தொடர்புடையதேயன்றித் தனித்தனியானவை அல்ல. இரண்டையும் சரியாகப் புரிந்து கொண்டு, நாட்டின் முன்னேற்றத்திற்குப் பாடுபடுவது அனைவரின் கடமையாகும்.

(ஆ) தற்காலத்தில் யாரும் எந்த உரிமையையும் கொண்டாடவில்லை. வலிமை மிகுந்தவர்கள் முக்கிய விஷயங்களைத் தீர்மானித்தனர். காலம் முன்னேற முன்னேற உரிமை என்ற சொல்லும் உருவெடுத்தது.

(இ) சமூக நல மேம்பாட்டுக் கொள்கைகள் நம்பிக்கைகள், போதனைகள் ஆகியவற்றின் தொகுப்பு தனிமனிதனுக்குச் சிறிதுசிறிதாக உரிமையைத் தர ஆரம்பித்தது. படிப்படியாக சமூகம் தனிமனிதனுக்குப் பாதுகாவலனாக உருவெடுத்து, குடிமக்களின் உரிமையைப் பாதுகாத்தது. ஒரு நாகரிகமான சமூகத்தில், ஒவ்வொரு குடிமகனும் தன்னால் நாட்டுக்கு என்ன கடமையைச் செய்ய முடியும் என யோசிக்க வேண்டுமேயொழிய, தனக்கு நாடு என்ன செய்யும் என யோசிக்கக்கூடாது.

(ஈ) ஒருவர் தனது உரிமைகளைக் கோரும் அதே சமயத்தில், சமூகத்திற்குத் தனது கடமையைத் தாய்வில்லாமல் ஆற்ற வேண்டும் என்பதையும் உணர வேண்டும்.

(உ) ஒருவனுடைய தேவைக்கேற்ப உரிமைகளைத் தருவதைப் போல் அவனது திறமைக்கேற்பக் கடமையைச் செய்ய வேண்டும் என்பதை ரஷ்ய அரசு எதிர்பார்க்கிறது.

(ஊ) வாழ்க்கையைச் சிறந்ததாக்க ஒருவன் தனது முழுமுயற்சியையும் முழு மனத்துடன் ஈடுபடுத்த வேண்டும். கடமையை வாழ்க்கையுடன் இணைத்து உரிமையைப் பெறவேண்டும்.

(எ) ஒவ்வொருவரும் மற்றவரது உரிமையை உணருவது மனித குலத்தின் அடிப்படைத் தத்துவமாகும். மனிதனாக இருக்கும் உரிமை என்பது அனைத்து உரிமைகளிலும் அடிப்படை உரிமையாகும். ஆனால் பலர் இதை உணர்வதில்லை. உணரவில்லை என்பதே உண்மை.

(ஏ) ஒவ்வொரு மனிதனும் தன்னுடைய கடமையைச் செய்யாமல் உரிமையைக் கோரமுடியாது. உரிமையைக் கோரும் எந்த ஒரு குடிமகனும் தனது கடமையை ஆற்றக் கடமைப்பட்டவராவார். உரிமையில்லாமல் கடமையில்லை, கடமையின்றி உரிமையுமில்லை என்பதை அனைவரும் உணர வேண்டும்.

(ஐ) உரிமையும் கடமையும் என்ற கருத்தை நியூட்டனின் மூன்றாவது இயக்க விதிக்கு ஒப்பிடலாம். "ஒவ்வொரு செயலுக்கும் அதற்குச் சமமான எதிர் செயல் உண்டு" என்ற விதிபோல், உரிமையும் கடமையும் ஒன்றையொன்று பிரிக்க முடியாமல் சம்பந்தப்பட்டதாகும். தாயில்லாமல் குழந்தையில்லை. குழந்தையில்லாமல் தாயுமில்லை என்பதைப்போல், கடமையின்றி உரிமையில்லை, உரிமையின்றிக் கடமையில்லை. கடமையைச் செய்பவர்களுக்கு உரிமை உள்ளது. கடமையைச் செய்யாதவர்களுக்கு உரிமையில்லை.

(ஓ) பிணக்குகள் கொண்ட, சூதுவாது நிறைந்த நிச்சயமற்ற தற்காலத்தில் மனிதர்கள் உரிமையைத் தவறாமல் கோருகிறார்கள். ஆனால் அதற்காக என்ன கடமையை ஆற்ற வேண்டுமோ அதனை வசதியாக மறந்து விடுகின்றனர். ஒவ்வொருவரும் அவரவருடைய கடமையைச் சரிவரச் செய்யாததனால் ஏற்படக்கூடிய பட்டமான சூழல் நிறைந்த இவ்வுலகில் வாழவேண்டிய கட்டாயம் ஏற்பட்டுள்ளது.

(ஔ) மற்றவர்களால் தனக்குத் துன்பம் வரக்கூடாது என்ற உரிமையை ஒருவன் கோரும்போது, தானும் மற்றவர்களுக்குத் துன்பம் தரக்கூடாது என்ற கடமையும் அவனுக்கு உள்ளது என்பதை மறந்துவிடக் கூடாது. தளர்த்தப்பட்ட சமூக வாழ்க்கை, உரிமையை மட்டுமே நினைக்க வைத்துள்ளது. மகிழ்ச்சியைத் தரவில்லை. நமது முன்னோர்கள் நம்மைவிட மகிழ்ச்சியாக இருக்கக் காரணம் அவர்கள் கடமையை முன்னிறுத்தி உரிமையைப் பின் வைத்தனர். தற்காலத்தில் உரிமையை முன்னிறுத்துவதால், தற்காலிக சுகம் கிடைக்கிறதேயொழிய நிரந்தர மகிழ்ச்சி கிடைக்கவில்லை.

(ஐ) தற்போதைய சமூக, பொருளாதார, அரசியல் தொய்வுக்குக் காரணம் கடமையை மறந்து அதிகமாக உரிமையைக் கொண்டாடுவதுதான் என்பதை மறந்துவிடக்கூடாது.

### முடிவுரை

இரு சக்கர வாகனங்களின் இரண்டு சக்கரங்களையும் போன்றது உரிமையும் கடமையும். ஏதேனும் ஒரு சக்கரம் இல்லாமல் எப்படி வண்டி இயங்காதோ, அதுபோல உரிமையின்றிக் கடமையின்மை! கடமையின்றி உரிமையின்மை! "கடமையை செய்பவர்களுக்கே உரிமை" என்ற ஹோபீஸ்டு பெருமானாரின் வார்த்தைகள் இத்தலைப்புக்கு முத்தாய்ப்பாக அமையும் என்பதில் இரு வேறு கருத்துகளுக்கு இடமில்லை.
