### INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES :

A lot can be said about the developments in the infrastructure facilities provided by the management, with special thanks to our Secretary, a great visionary who takes care of the welfare of the students community.

### THE PROPOSED GATEWAY OF VAISHNAV :

The latest face-lift to the infrastructure resembles the Gateway of India. Through this enter the inquisitive, innocent and fragile students of today to be shaped into sparkling youth of tomorrow wielding knowledge, wisdom and empowerment.

### LIBRARIES :

One general and one for Post Graduate students, with a collection of nearly 30,000 books and a wide range of quality magazines, with a computerized library management system, all accommodated in a hi-tech setup in the new IT Block. Extensive reading by student is encouraged.

## SCHOLARSHIPS :

Nearly 1000 students enjoy the benefit of scholarships from Government and Private bodies. The Maharani Vidhyawathi Endowment Trust provides a generous scholarship of Rs.1500/- p.a. each to 59 students.

## ENDOWMENT BY PRIVATE BODIES (2004-2005):

This year Mr. Krishnamoorthy has instituted an endowment of Rs.12,000/- in the name of his wife Smt. Uma Krishnamoorthy to be given to the best student in **STATISTICS**.

Smt. Annapoorani Seetharam instituted another endowment for Rs.10,000/- for the award of Sri. S.R. Seetharaman Memorial Book Prize for proficiency in chemistry for II Year student.

## E-EDU GOVERNANCE :-

The technological revolution of our college is completing its third successful year. Apart from equipping students with the power of knowledge to serve and excel in the field of IT, it is also providing great assistance to the various aspects of the academic activities.

## NATIONAL ASSESSMENT ACCREDITATION COUNCIL :

Our institution was awarded the "A" grade status by the **NAAC - UGC** in the year **2003-2004**. For a sustained quality education and to attain the excellent status, the highly committed management, staff and students are striving hard to achieve the same.

## ACADEMIC EXPANSION :

### ICWA CLASSES :

ICWA-INSTITUTE of Cost and Works Accounts has instituted an extension centre for foundation course for 25 students. Our own staff from departments of Commerce, mathematics and Economics are handling the classes.

### ADD ON COURSES :

The College has also seen diversification in several avenues of education this year. The UGC sponsored Add on Courses namely Functional English, EDP and Travel And Tourism were approved. The Functional English Course had its beginning in the academic year 2004-2005. The EDP and Travel And Tourism Course will be started in the forth-coming years. In the self-financing stream 3-new courses, B.Sc Infosystem and Management, M.Sc Applicable Mathematics and certificate course in Travel And Ticketing were also initiated.

Travel And Ticketing is a course, which gives job placements to students immediately after they finish their course. Infact, the first batch of students who are yet to complete their course have been offered jobs!!!!

To stress the importance of quality education and self-empowerment, we have proposals to venture out in the science stream with "Inter-disciplinary innovative PG programmes" with UGC sanction. Things have started crystallizing and soon our students may be exposed to this venue of learning also.

## BIO - REVOLUTION

In the present century the depletion of environmental resources becomes a great peril to mankind. Man in order to fulfil his needs, by his harmful activity started depleting the nature by various methods like Deforestation, Converting Agricultural land into Official buildings, Schools, Colleges, Apartments etc., so there is no way for our climate to become cool and to bring rainfall. So "Think globally, act locally" to prevent our mother nature from further degradation and by the above methods we can surely make our nature a "GREEN GOLD"

Kalidasa the greatest poet of Sanskrit Literature is acclaimed as the Divine Poet who received his knowledge and art of poetry through the blessings of Goddess Kali-hence the name Kalidasa. Blessed by a goddess, he owes respect and regard not only to the woman goddess who made him what he is but also to all women and womanhood. A brushup through his works gives an interesting account of various women characters who stand a model or example of how woman should be and should not be. In this article I would like to discuss some of his vibrant women characters who have stood the test of time for their virtues and till day quoted for the same.

### Maalavikaa - (WOMAN AS A STUDENT)

In a short play called Maalavikagnimitram we come across a bright, beautiful and dedicated student called Maalavika. She learns the Bharathanatyaa from her guru Ganadasa. When he is asked about her performance he proudly replies.

यद्यत्प्रयोगविषये भाविकमुपदिश्यते मया तस्यै ।

तत्तद्विशेषकरणात्प्रत्युपदिशतीव मे बाला । ।

### Meaning :

Whatever I teach she grasps it so well and performs it in such a way that I learn more from her redoing.

These lines bring out the intelligence and dedication of a student that is required and also throws light in the fact that women had all privileges of learning and they were not deprived of education and due recognition in olden times as we feel.

### Paarvathi - (WOMAN AS A DAUGHTER)

Our tradition and religion commands us to respect or rather worship our parents. But these words would be anachronisms today when we children think we know better and take decisions, decisions for our life on our own. This would prove fatal to women in particular in matters like marriage.

### Meaning :

Let the King of mountains my giver of marriage give his verdict.

The marriage of lord Shiva and Paarvathi took place with the blessings of their parents and in the presence of all the gods and devas and with their wishes the way the marriage should be.

Shiva and Paarvathi are looked upon as a model couple.

As a contrast to Paarvathi we have Shakunthala in Abhijnana Shakunthalam.

Shakunthala falls in love with the Prince Dushyantha and loses herself to him. But he deserts her and Shakunthala is able to reunite with her lover only with the help of her father Vishwamithra.

In today's world of elopements, affairs, and breaking apart or departing as friends, these two works have a lot to teach us.

### Sita - (WOMAN AS A WIFE)

Sita in Raghuvamsham is depicted by Kalidasa as all good chaste, calm, and courageous. She is referred to as the wealth of RAMA. That is why when Rama leaves for the forest followed by Sita Kalidasa reaches heights of poetic description by describing her as

वभौ तमनुगच्छन्ती विदेहाधिपतेः सुता ।

प्रतिषिद्धापि कैकेय्या लक्ष्मीरिव गुणोन्मुखी । ।

Meaning :

The daughter of the Lord of Videhas shone like the goddess of kingship and wealth, following him in her fondness for his virtues though prohibited by Kaikeyi.

Later when Sita is abducted by Ravana and held captive in Ashokavana Hanuman comes to her rescue. Seeing her miserable state Hanuman offers to carry her on his shoulders to the place of her husband. But Sita as a true Paathivrada declines that and justifies that it would be a disgrace for her husband if people are going to tell Ravana took her to the forest and Hanuman brought her back and she knows the courage and valour and love her husband bears for her and so he would come, conquer Lanka and take her back with him.

Maalavika, Paarvathi or Sita are not just characters or idols. But are embodiments of ideals who have lived with these virtues in them in reality. They stand a testimony to the fact that if women are good they would be respected, protected and above all worshipped.
