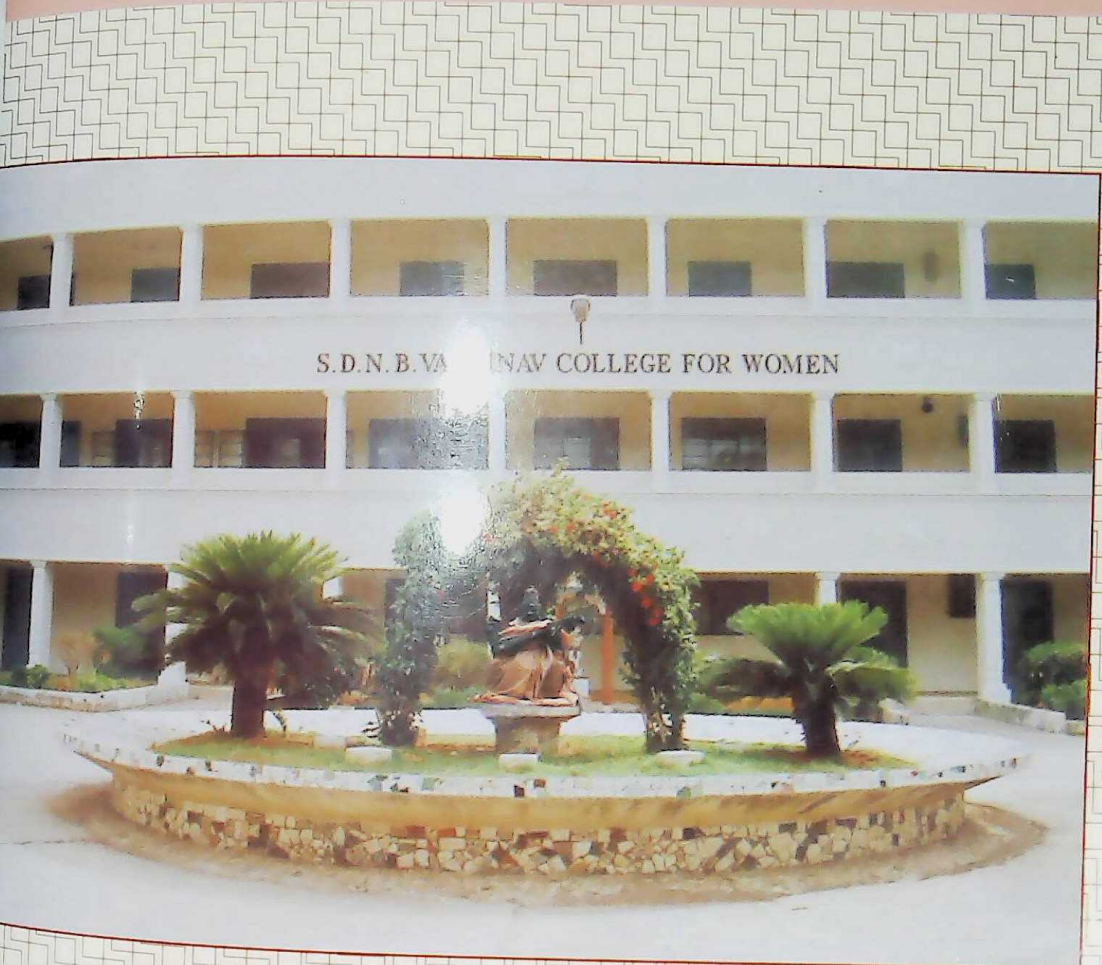

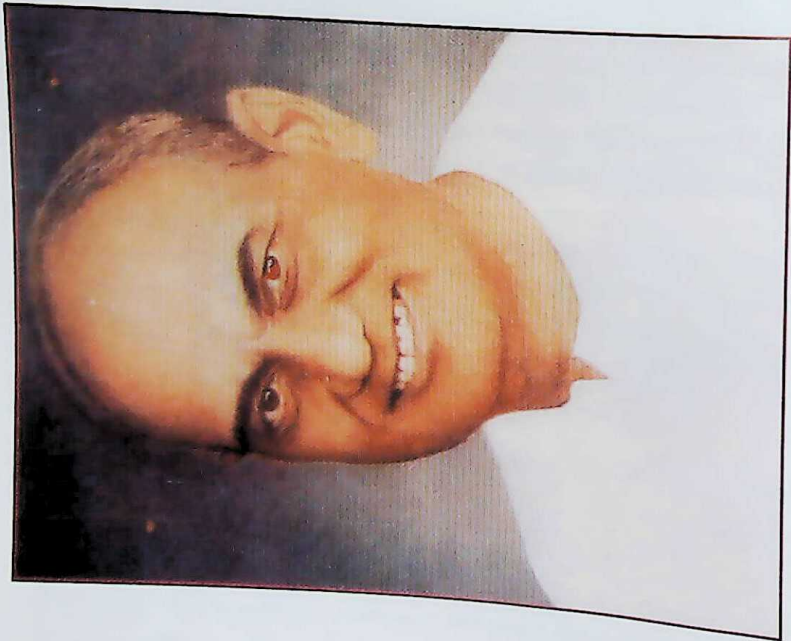

He started this institution in the name of his beloved wife Smt. Devkunvar Nanalal Bhatt to serve the cause of womens' education.

After nearly 3.8 decades we have made steady progress and we are now in an enviable position in the academic arena.

1. MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE:

All our achievements are due to the able guidance provided by the management committee.

The Management Committee meets periodically, takes policy decisions and reviews the progress and developments made on such decisions.

We have a strong contingent of Day and Evening college faculty who are committed, sincere and active, assisted by the supportive non-teaching staff, helping in the smooth functioning of our college.

2. INFRASTRUCTURE FACILITIES:

A lot can be said about the developments in the infrastructure facilities provided by the management, with special thanks to our secretary, a great gentleman, who plans

- * 10 acres of land in the quiet outskirts of the city.
- * Huge concrete structures with 60 spacious, well-lit, ventilated and fully furnished classrooms.
- * A separate building for the administration workload under the **autonomous** structure.
- * Air-conditioned computer labs with Internet and Intranet facilities.
- * Staff rooms with computers and intercom phone connections.
- * A well furnished auditorium to accommodate about 2000 students.
- * A conference hall with a capacity of 200 seats.
- * A spacious canteen, which can cater to about 300 people at a time.
- * Well-equipped labs for all science subjects.
- * Athletic track, grounds, courts for various sports.
- * A decorative exterior facelift to the building making it appear like a real Temple of learning.
- * A very good cricket pitch.
- * Lush green lawns with flowerbeds, shrubs and trees giving the campus a nature fresh, serene and tranquil ambience for the learners.

3. LIBRARIES:

One general and one for Post Graduate students, with a collection of nearly 30,000 books and a wide range of quality magazines, with a computerized library management system, all accommodated in a hi-tech setup in the IT Block. Extensive reading by students is encouraged.

4. SCHOLARSHIPS:

Nearly 1000 students enjoy the benefit of scholarships from Government and Private bodies. The Maharani Vidhyawathi Endowment Trust provides a generous scholarship of Rs.1,500/- p.a. each to 60 students.

5. E-EDU GOVERNANCE:

The human brain, the super CPU created by the Almighty is successfully competing with the Artificial Intelligence in the Man-Machine race. But anyhow technological revolution of our college is completing its fourth successful year. Apart from equipping students with the power of knowledge to serve and excel in the field of IT, it is also providing assistance to the various aspects of the academic activities.

6. IQAC:

The college was accredited with 'A' grade by NAAC in 2003-04 recognising the quality of education imparted to students. An Internal Quality Assurance Cell has now been set up as a follow up step to check the quality of inputs and outputs and exercise quality control and improve the standards of performance.

7. ACADEMIC EXPANSION:

The UGC sponsored Add-on Courses — a diversified avenue in the field of Functional English, EDP and Travel & Tourism are completing a successful year. The students are loaded with course content which will enable them to face the job market with a high level of confidence and self-motivation.

8. ACADEMIC IN-DEPTH PROGRAMS:

Opportunities were provided to the academic fraternity to explore the unknown and express their observations and experiment their ideas through seminar and workshops during this academic year.

A two-day National Conference was hosted by Department of English on the topic Indian Writing in English-Culture and Folk theatre. It was inaugurated by Dr.C.T. Indra, H.O.D of English, University of Madras and the valedictory session was chaired by Dr. Hanne M.De Bruin, Facilitator, TN Kattai Koothu Kalai Valarchi Munnetra Sangam. The curtains came down after an excellent Indian folk dance presentation by the troupe led by the chairperson.

A two-day State level Seminar was conducted by Department of Commerce on the topic "The Power of Women in Entrepreneurial Development Program - Technical Implications". Dr. Mrs. Nirmala Prasad, Principal, M.O.P. Vaishnav College and Mrs. Lalitha Laxmanan, AGM of Canara Bank inaugurated it. Dr. V. Balu, Director, P.G. Dept. DB Jain College and former Controller, University of Madras headed the valedictory session.

National Level Conference on Indian Writings in English, Culture and Folk Theatre

The Department of English of S.D.N.B. Vaishnav College for Women - Chromepet had the privilege of hosting a National level Conference on Indian Writings in English, Culture and Folk Theatre which was sponsored by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi. This conference was held on 2nd and 3rd September 2005 and a galaxy of eminent academics and Professors from different parts of the country participated in the two-day conference.

The formal inauguration of the Conference began with the traditional lighting of the lamp by Dr. C.T. Indra, Prof. and Head of the Department of English, University of Madras. The welcome address was given by Dr. V. Muthulakshmi, Head of the Department of English, S.D.N.B. Vaishnav College for Women, the convenor for the Conference. Dr. T. Sumitra, Principal of the college speaking on the occasion pointed out the relevance of such conferences in the modern context.

Dr. C.T. Indra in her inaugural address highlighted the need for a purely Indian methodology to critique Indian literature - both Indian writing in English and Indian writing in Bhashas (other Indian languages). Post colonial criticism had resulted in a greater degree of cultural consciousness and made writing an act of patriotism. The great divide between Indian Writing in English and in Bhashas was also pointed out by her. She also commented on how much of third world literature is not available in translation and underlined the need for the same.

The plenary session on 2nd September was addressed by Dr. C.N. Srinath, Director 'Dhvanyaloka', Resource Centre for Commonwealth Literature, Mysore. Speaking on some of the forgotten Classics in Indian Fiction, he took the audience on a journey of discovery to some of the old classics like Pratap Sharma's "Day of the Turban" and obscure novels of Raja Rao. His talk threw light on novels, which were not frequently read or heard.

Prof. Mohan Ramanan, Head of the Department of English, University of Hyderabad speaking on diasporic on various levels within a state.

Dr. Usha Menon, from Trivandrum, Kerala spoke on "Gender Matters in Translation", punning on 'gender matters(!)'. Being a women's institution, her talk found a receptive audience.

The role of the Press and the Publishing industry were the focus of the talk of Mrs. Mini Krishnan's from the Oxford University Press. Ms. Priya Sarukkai from Pune, a novelist and poet gave the audience a peep into the workings of a creative mind and also read out from her own poetical compositions and translations of 'aham' and 'puram' poetry.

3rd September 2005, the 2nd day of the Conference saw Dr. Nilufer Bharucha, Head of the Department of English, University of Mumbai giving a historical perspective of Indian Literature in Diaspora. She traced the beginnings of diasporic writing in the West Indies, Canada and the U.S. She reasoned out that migrants were resented by the stay-at-homes because they fulfilled their dreams. The role of cross-over films and the media also were stressed by her as they had wider reach.

Dr. Nirmal Selvamony, from the Madras Christian College - Tambaram threw light on the fascinating subject of eco-poetry pointing out that the ancient Sangam poetry laid emphasis on the ecology of the land with the fauna and flora of the region finding place in the literature. He even traced how ecology was an integral part of Robert Burns' poetry and even illustrated it with Hopkins' sonnet - "God's Grandeur".

An interesting panel discussion debated the point whether Indian Writers Writing in English write for foreign readers rather than for Indian readers? It was headed by Dr. Mohan Ramanan, with Dr. V. Rajagopalan of Madras Christian College, Dr. Bharathi Harishankar of Institute of Distance Education, University of Madras and Dr. Gowri Ramnarayan of The Hindu as the other panelists.

About 40 paper presentations were made by teachers from various colleges of Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry and Karnataka. Eminent Professors from city colleges moderated the sessions.

The grand finale of the two-day Conference was "Karna Moksha" a "Therukoothu" by the Tamil Nadu Kattai-Kuttu-Kalai Valarchi Munnetra Sangam and Kattaikoothu Youth Theatre school of Kanchipuram. The facilitator for this group was Dr. Hanne M. De Bruin. It was a truly exhilarating experience and a colourful spectacle which brought to life the rich folk-culture and tradition of South India.

The Conference ended on a dramatic note in keeping with the theme and gave us a taste of the living folk tradition.

NSS REPORT

On 14th Feb 2006 a Leprosy Awareness Campaign was conducted by Dr. Illango, Leprologist and his team from Gremaltes Hospital, Shenoy Nagar, Chennai. His lecture was followed by a slide show on Leprosy. NSS volunteers attended the programme and interacted with the doctor, health educator and Facilitator and cleared their doubts about Leprosy.

On 18th Feb 2006 about 20 NSS volunteers visited GOOD LIFE CENTRE, West Tambaram, a home for Mentally Retarded. They spent two hours with the inmates playing games and entertaining them. National Service Scheme, University of Madras and Traffic Commissioner of Police jointly organized the Red Flag Movement, a Movement started to educate the masses on averting accidents by stopping before the Stop Line. Twenty NSS volunteers of the college were assigned the duty of regulating the traffic from 2nd March 2006 to 7th March 2006 at Chromepet Bus stand on GST Road.

On March 7th 2006 Spastics Society of Tamil Nadu, and SDNB Vaishnav College conducted an Awareness Programme on Special Children and Disability. All 100 volunteers of NSS unit participated.

A Special NSS camp was conducted for 40 volunteers at Kondamangalam Village, Singaperumal Koil, from 11th March to 20th March 2006.

The camp was inaugurated by Dr. Mrs. T. Sumitra, Principal of SDNB Vaishnav college on 11th March 2006. She briefed the NSS volunteers on the behavioral aspects during the camp. Secretary, Vidhyashree, of II Maths, thanked the gathering.

The Programme Officer charted out the projects. The volunteers were accommodated at Ceyrac Trust at Gokulapuram village, Singaperumal koil. The camp focused on honing the skills possessed by the students. They had plenty of opportunities to improve their spoken skills, Personality Development skills, Compering skills etc.

The students also visited a creche run by CSI at Melrosapuram and spent time with the tiny tots and also witnessed the demonstration on making paper cups of various sizes and shapes, by Self Help Groups of Gokulapuram village. The next day's activities kept the student volunteers on their toes as they arranged for a Kolam and Cooking competition for the women of Govindapuram village. It was astounding to see their dexterity with which the young ladies drew artistic kolams.

Mrs. and Mr. Radhakrishnan, both HIV patients delivered a lecture on AIDS to people at Kondamangalam village. Several competitions were held for students both at elementary and High school level at Melrosapuram and at Malleswaram St. Anne's Primary English School.

NSS volunteers were busy preparing for the cultural show for the Valedictory Function on 20th March 2006. Prof. N. Raja Hussain NSS Co-Ordinator, University of Madras, was the Chief Guest.

The ten-day Special Camp opened new vistas to students to learn to be independent, adjusting, expressive, responsible, tolerant and active. Enthusiastic participation was seen among the volunteers throughout the ten days. The camp was completed successfully after 10 days service in villages. Sanskrit contains some of the most valuable literature of the Indian subcontinent. Indian authors have displayed a profound knowledge of the human nature and have given sound moral advice with respect to the various situations in which human beings are likely to be wound up.

Mahabaratha, the fifth veda, has many episodes woven around a central theme, dealing with almost every aspect of human welfare. The most important of this is Vidhuraneethi, the moral advice of Vidhura to Dhritarashtra.

Vidhura, in short discourses, covers a wide field of individual and social life. A wise man is

क्रोधो हर्षश्च दर्पश्च ही स्तंभो मान्यमानिता।

यमर्थान्नापकर्षन्ति स वै पण्डित उच्यते।।

He whom neither anger nor joy, neither pride nor bashfulness, neither obstinacy self-esteem, drags away from the high ends of life is verily called wise.

He identifies a fool as

अश्रुतश्च समुबद्धो दरिद्रश्च महात्मानाः।

अर्थाश्चाकर्मण प्रेप्सुर्मूढ इत्युच्यते बुधैः

He who has no learning, yet is conceited who though poor, yet proved (or of inordinate desires), who wishes to achieve objects (or wealth), by immoral means (or by remaining inactive), he is called a fool.

Vidhura lays stern importance on good conduct, good behaviour, which is understood by the following,

यो नोद्धतं कुरुते जानु वेपं

न पौरुषेणापि विकथयेऽन्यान्।

न मूर्च्छितः कटुकान्याह किञ्चित्

प्रियं सदा तं कुरुते जनो हि।

He who never puts on a haughty air (or is never gaudily dressed), who never reviles others boasting himself the while and who never speaks harsh to others getting himself excited (oblivious of himself) he is indeed ever endeared by all.

About nobility of character, he says

न स्वे वैकुरुते प्रहर्षः

नान्यस्य दुःखे भवति प्रहृष्टः।

दत्त्वा न पश्चात् कुरुतेऽनुपायं

स कथ्यते सन् पुरुषार्थशीलः।।

He, is called a man of noble character worthy of the virtuous, who does not exult in his happiness nor is delighted in another's misery, and who does not repent after having once made a gift of anything.

Vidhura, about administration says that,

चत्वारि राज्ञा तु महाबलेन
वज्यन्धिहुः पण्डितस्तानि विद्यान्
अल्पप्रज्ञैःसह मन्त्रं न कुर्या-
न्न दीर्घसूत्रैरलसै-श्चारणैश्च ।।

A king, though high and mighty, should avoid these four, and a wise man should know them, viz. he should not take counsel of men of little wisdom, not of the dilatory, of the indolent, not of the flattering bards.

The above are a few areas touched upon by Vidhura. If Bhagavad Gita is for enlightenment that is spiritual, then Vidhura-Niti is for enlightenment that is temporal.
