## COLLEGE DAY REPORT 2017-18

Our esteemed Chief Guest Honourable Minister Ma Foi K. Pandiarajan, Minister for Tamil Official Language and Tamil Culture (Government of Tamil Nadu), Dynamic Chairman Smt. Mamta D Bhatt, our most respected Secretary Shri Chandrakant M Tolia, Chairman Cork Industries, Shri S N Bhatt, Managing committee members, distinguished guests, alumni, parents, members of the staff, both teaching and non-teaching and my dear young students, I extend a very cordial welcome to each one of you here.

On the occasion of the 50th College Day with the blessings of Almighty, I present before you a brief report about the achievement and activities of our college during the academic year 2017-18.

The prime focus of our Institution is to enrich the future of young women by providing them with holistic education. As every year, this year too our college campus buzzed with vibrant and edutainment programmes to advocate the nuance of academia to young women students.

**Genesis of the College** - Shrimathi Devkunvar Nanalal Bhatt Vaishnav College for Women was started in 1968 with the generous donation of 10 acres of land by our Late Founder Chairman Shri Nanalal Bhatt and 6 lakhs donated by Cork Industries Charities Trust. The College stands in the name of our Late Founder Chairman's beloved wife Shrimathi Devkunvar. The College has efficiently rendered more than four decades of dedicated service to the cause of women's education. Self-financing courses under evening stream were started in the year 1984-85 at the undergraduate level and in 2001 at the Postgraduate level. The college has been continuously accredited with 'A' grade by NAAC in the first two cycles and last year the college was re-accredited with 'A+' Grade in the 3rd cycle. The College has been functioning as an Autonomous Institution affiliated to University of Madras since 2006. We have a total student strength of about 5200 in Aided and Self-Supporting Structure. The College offers 23 Undergraduate, 11 post Graduate, 4 M. Phil., and 6 FT & 4 PT research programs,

Our management members actively evince a keen interest in the functionalities of our college in all quarters of academic and non-academic developments.

### MANAGEMENT

The management committee is a stronghold as well as a positive driving force for our success and achievement. Our college chairman Smt. Mamta D. Bhatt and our College Secretary Shri Chandrakant M. Tolia are great sources of inspiration. Our college management committee and Governing Body Members are also supportive in all our academic and non academic endeavours.

### INFRASTRUCTURE

The College has well developed state-of-the-art infrastructure with varied techno facilities, smart classrooms equipped with interactive boards and laboratory facilities. The proposed digital library will get its structure in the forthcoming year, and the extension of our hostel for international students is a great draw in our golden jubilee year. The renovated air conditioned auditorium will be inaugurated in the next academic year which will mark the milestone of our golden jubilee celebrations. The futuristic labs with all modern facilities pave way for our students to have a holistic practical education.

### NAAC

Last year our college has been accredited with 'A+' by NAAC and the committee has recognized our institution as one of the high performing colleges. As a mark of honour the college accreditation has been extended till 2024.

### IQAC

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell is the nodal agency for creating a Learner Centric environment, monitoring quality parameters & developing quality culture. The cell manages data through effective college information system and obtains regular feedback from all the stakeholders.

**Academic Organization** – the organization is headed by the Principal along with the Deans of various educational disciplines like Mathematical Sciences, Arts, Commerce, New Age Sciences & Extension Activities to monitor and streamline various activities of the College.

### **ACADEMIC BODIES (BOS, Academic council, Governing body)**

This year academic audits of all departments were organized by the IQAC for monitoring and assuring quality education and knowledge resources for the students. All departments convene Board of studies meeting annually to amalgamate the current requisites of educational components to the syllabi which is approved by the Academic Council and the Governing Body of our college.

### **FUNDING BY DBT**

Our college initiated Star College Scheme in 2008, funded by DBT, Ministry of HRD, Government of India to nurture excellence in undergraduate science education for holistic development of colleges. We have so far received a grant of Rs.22 lakhs under this scheme for Under Graduate departments and the beneficiary departments are, Department of Physics, Department of Chemistry and Department of Plant Biology and Plant Biotechnology.

Enhanced admission of students with high percentage of marks in life science courses is one of the prominent impacts of STAR College scheme.

Students and staff have been given hands on training and various industrial exposures as well as getting opportunities to undertake individual research projects.

### **MOU**

Our College is an authorized study centre for conducting foundation and intermediate courses in CMA, ICSI and ICAI. The department of Commerce has signed two MOUs: one with Tata Consultancy Services and another one with International Chamber of Indirect Tax Professionals.

### **SCHOLARSHIPS**

Our college management and other generous private bodies extend their helping hand to our economically deprived students by offering scholarships to them. More than 200 students are benefitted and this generous act has boosted their morale and also to concentrate more on academics.

### **RESEARCH**

The quality of education largely depends on the quality of teachers. In pursuit of knowledge and excellence, our faculty members always demonstrate a keen interest in research as 54 professors are approved Supervisors for Ph.D programmes.

Recently two staff members of computer science department of self-finance stream Dr.C.Victoria Pricilla and Dr.N.Priya have been approved as research supervisor for Ph.D.

Our college management has sanctioned research seed fund for 10 ( SFS )staff members to undertake Minor Research Projects to flourish their research pursuits. Dr. G.Gayathri Devi, Assistant Professor of computer science department is doing her UGC minor research project.

There are 19 full time Ph.D scholars and 33 Part time Ph.D scholars. This year 10 faculty members have been awarded PhD degree. Dr. R.Savithri, Head, Department of Commerce has guided Ms. S.Kamatchi, Ms. Y.Kalaivani and Ms. Meenakshi, Dr. N. Gajalakshmi, Associate Professor of Economics has guided Ms.G.Shanthi, Dr.A.Dhanalakshmi, Associate Professor of Commerce has guided Ms. T.Devi Kamatchi under the University of Madras and Dr. C.P.Sumathi, Dr. R.Radha, Associate Professors of Computer Science have guided students for the award of Doctorate degree from other universities.

Mrs. D.Annaporani department of Statistics has submitted her thesis under UGC sponsored faculty improvement programme.

Dr. G.Rani, former Principal and Academic advisor of our college has completed her major research project. Under her guidance Mrs. Suganthi, project assistant has submitted the report.

### **STAFF ACHIEVEMENT**

Our faculty members are very active to hone their research-oriented skills by presenting and publishing research papers in various national and international conferences and journals of international repute.

### **STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT**

A good number of Undergraduate and Post graduate students have participated and presented research papers in various national and international conferences across India.

### **CAREER ORIENTED PROGRAMMES**

UGC sponsored career oriented programmes like Women Entrepreneurship and Mushroom Cultivation programmes are being offered for the students.

**SKILL BASED CERTIFICATE COURSES:** Our college offers twelve skill based certificate courses for students. This year to sail with time, we have introduced Goods and Service Tax (GST) course to our students.

### **CONVOCATION**

The Convocation for the students of the Batch 2014-17 was conducted on 18th January, 2018 at Kamaraj Arangam. ## HOSTEL DAY REPORT FOR 2017 - 2018

We are very much grateful and honoured to submit the SDNBVC Hostel Day Report for the year 2017-2018. The Hostel has crossed yet another splendid and successful year. It is said that "Home is sweet". But even then life at home cannot be compared to the life in a hostel. The life in a hostel is different from that of the home. It is also a temple of dwelling and learning place for life through quality education. For many students, it is a nurturing ground to exhibit their talents and engage themselves in creative activities. Apart from the general rules and regulations, which are to be followed necessarily by everyone, one is her own mistress.

In a hostel, a student comes in contact with a number of other students. She acquires many good qualities from them. She too tries to be healthy. One good student may become an example for other hostellers. When one is ill, all her hostel fellows try their best to serve her. Mutual cooperation, sympathy and love are the characteristics of hostel life. It will not be an exaggeration to say, that only a hostel is the place where an all-round development of personality is possible. Hostels provide the best atmosphere for study. They work very hard when the time comes for it. Weaker students can always get help from their friends. When a careless and negligent student sees her partner or her neighbour competing for position, she also tries to follow her example. Hostel life not only develops the spirit of healthy competition, but also teaches the lesson of mutual cooperation.

The hostel is a confluence of students from different districts and parts of Tamil Nadu like Nagarkoil, Thirunelveli, Salem Dharmapuri, Krishnagiri, Thiruvavur Trichy, Villupuram, Cuddalore, Neyveli, Thiruvannamalai Arani Cheyyar, Kanchipuram. and from Union territory Puducherry and Andaman & Nicobar. Students from other states of India like Punjab, Jharkhand, Gujarat, Andhra Pradesh, Kerala are staying in the campus.

Our hostel has well equipped facilities with nearly 70 rooms apart from the Library, Internet computer centre, Study hall, Visitors lounge, UPS, Generator, Napkin incinerator, Out door play field area, gym and yoga, RO mineral plant and Cooler. The Hostel building is surrounded with green lawn and floral garden. Hostel creates an excellent milieu for the rural and economically poor students, particularly the first generation learners to excel in their academics. We feel that it is an enriching experience for many more students to live in a multicultural environment. The hostel administration is maintained, by the Chairman and the management members. Few deserving students in Sports have been given free accommodation in the hostel. I am grateful to all my Management Committee members for their support.

With this introduction let me start to present before you, a brief report about the Activities and Achievements of this year. This academic year the hostel was reopened on 6th June for 2nd and 3rd year and 15th June for 1st year. This academic year we were able to accommodate 130 Under Graduate and 4 Post Graduate students in two blocks. To meet the demands of more students seeking the hostel accommodation, two more floors are being constructed under construction, which is a big blessing for the students.

"Prayer is not a spare wheel that you pull out when in trouble, but it is a steering wheel, that directs the right path. The day begins in the morning with divine presence by a prayer and Attendance. The study hour starts after the evening Prayer and Attendance. During the evening attendance students read out sayings (Thought for the Day) and the news headlines from daily newspapers.

"Leadership is unlocking peoples potential to become better"-To have effective functioning as well as to involve the students in taking up various responsibilities in the hostel, Ms. Jayalakshmi of III Physics and Ms. Lavanya of I computer science, were elected as President and vice president, in the 1st week of July. They act as liaison between the students and the administration and facilitate better participation of the hostellers. Few committees such as Discipline, study, food, cleanliness, cultural and decoration have been formed. It creates an ample opportunity for them.

After the formation of Hostel committee, students have undergone a medical check up on 13th July 2017 by the Doctors and staff of Apollo Shine Clinic. Dr. Nilofer and Dr. Catherine Mary of Apollo Shine Clinic have appreciated our arrangement of medical camp. In their service they have not experienced such timely and perfect arrangement of the medical camp. We are extremely happy to have Apollo Shine clinic in the college campus.

To welcome the new comers and make them feel at ease in the hostel, fresher's Eve was organised by the senior students in the hostel with the help of wardens. This academic year, we started our journey by imploring showers of blessings from God with a Freshers eve celebration on 27th July, 2017. The freshers were welcomed by the seniors through an exorbitant cultural program, which created the feelings of oneness among them.

Monitored study hours of the students are observed from Monday to Friday. The hostel provides a serene atmosphere and clean surroundings to the students for their study and stay.

Yoga classes are conducted to help the students to lead a better and healthier life. Yoga classes were started in the month of July; Mrs. Thiruselvi is taking classes in 2 sessions. First session in the morning for Shift II and the second session in the afternoon for shift I students, on Tuesdays and Thursdays of every week. These classes are conducted to develop harmony between body and mind. Students were trained in physical exercises, Kayakalpa exercise, meditation and self examination. These classes would help our students to lead a healthy, happy and prosperous life.

Food committee prepares the menu with modern culinary recipes and gives periodic suggestions regarding the food. The food committee meeting with Principal, Hostel Management Committee Members and Mess Contractors was held on 11th September 2017. The student's grievances were sorted out amicably.

Discipline committee encourage the students to do what is expected of them in time and place. It is taking care of the discipline in the hostel. மூன்றுரை:

இதழ்த்தோராம் நூற்றாண்டின் மிகப்பெரிய பிரச்சனையாக உருவெடுத்திருப்பது தண்ணீர் பிரச்சனையாகும். தண்ணீர் பிரச்சனையைச் சமாளிக்க நதிகளின் நிரை இணைப்பு ஒன்றே தீவிரமாகும் எனப் பல்லாண்டுகளாகப் பேசப்பட்டு வருகிறது. இதற்கு ஆண்டொன்றுக்கு 56 கோடி ரூபாய் செலவாகும் எனத் திட்டமிடப்படுகிறது. இனி நதிநீர் இணைப்பு குறித்து இக்கட்டுரையில் காண்போம்.

கமைப்பு:

ஆயிரம் மீட்டர் நீளத்திற்கு கால்வாய் வெட்டி 30 நதிகளை அடுத்த இரண்டு ஆண்டுகளில் இணைக்கலாம். இதற்கு 10 ஆயிரம் மெகாவாட் மின்சாரம் தேவைப்படும். இதற்கு 11 கியூசெக்ஸ் நீர் தேவைப்படும். நதி நீர் இணைப்பு திட்டத்தைச் செயல்படுத்த எந்த இடத்தின் வழியாக கால்வாய் அமைத்தால் பயனுள்ளதாக இருக்கும் எனத் திட்டமிட வேண்டும். கோதாவரி, மகாநதி, ஆகிய நதிகளில் நீர் அதிகம் உள்ளது. ஆனால் எந்த இடத்தின் வழியாக இணைக்க வேண்டும் என வல்லுநர்களிடையே விவாதிக்க வேண்டும். கேப்டன் டாஸ்டர் என்பவர் 1997 ஆம் ஆண்டு மீயமலையில் இருந்து பிறக்கும் நதிகளும், மேற்கு தொடர்ச்சி மலையில் பிறக்கும் நதிகளும் இணைப்பதைக் குறித்து கோர்லேண்ட் கனாலஸ் பல கருத்துக்களைக் கூறுகிறார்.

இன்றியமையாமை:

மழைக்காலங்களில் வடஇந்தியாவில் இருக்கும் நதிகளில் வெள்ள அபாயம் ஏற்படுகிறது. இதனைத் தீர்க்க கால்வாய் வெட்டி இந்நீரை ஒருநிலைப்படுத்த வேண்டும். கால்வாய் வெட்டுவதன் மூலம் ஏராளமான தொழிலாளர்களுக்கு வேலை கிடைப்பதுடன் கூடுதல் வருவாயும் கிடைக்கும். மழைக்காலங்களில் பெய்யும் மழையைச் சேமிக்கத் திட்டமிட வேண்டும்.

குறைபாடுகள்:

மழைக்காலங்களில் மட்டுமே இத்திட்டத்தின் மூலம் நீர் பெறமுடியும். கங்கை கோதாவரி மகாநதி முதலிய நதிகளைத் தென்னிந்திய நதிகளோடு இணைத்தால் மட்டுமே ஆண்டு முழுவதும் தண்ணீர் பெறமுடியும். இந்தியாவில் பல கடைக்கோடி கிராமங்களுக்குச் சராசரியாக இரண்டு லிட்டர் தண்ணீர் கூட கிடைப்பதில்லை. ஆனால் ஒரு புள்ளி விவரத்தில் அமெரிக்காவில் இருக்கும் மக்களுக்கு மழைநீரைச் சேமிப்பதாலும், நதிநீரை நாடு முழுமைக்கும் சிறப்பாக பயன்படுத்துவதாலும் 5910 லிட்டர் தண்ணீர் கிடைக்கிறது.

தண்ணீர் தேவையும் பற்றாக்குறையும்:

விவசாயத் துறைதான் இந்தியாவின் பொருளாதாரத்தை நிர்ணயிக்கும். மக்களின் வாழ்வாதாரத்தை விவசாயத் துறைதான் பாதுகாத்து வருகிறது. இந்தியாவில் உள்ள விவசாய நிலங்களில் 46 சதவீதம் தான் நீர்ப்பாசனம் கொண்டது. மற்ற நிலங்களெல்லாம் மானாவரிநிலம்.

உணவு பாதுகாப்பின் முக்கிய காரணியாக இருப்பது தண்ணீர் தான். மின்சார நிலையம் தொழிற்சாலை மற்றும் பல இடங்களுக்கு நீர் தேவைப்படுகிறது.

ஆனால் தமிழ்நாடு தண்ணீர்வாரியம் கணக்குப்படி எவ்வளவு தண்ணீர் மொத்தமாக தேவைப்படுகிறது எனப் பட்டியல் செய்தனர். 2012 ஆம் ஆண்டு கணக்கு 27 டி.எம்.சி / வருடம்

என்பது மொத்தமாக 1941 டிஎம்சி/வருடம் தேவைப்படுகிறது. ஆனால் இந்தியா நிலத்தடியில் இருக்கும் மொத்த தண்ணீர் 1643 டிஎம்சி/வருடம். ஆக எப்போதோ, இவ்வளவு நீர்ப்பற்றாக்குறை உள்ளது. இன்னும் வருங்காலத்தில் என்பது, ஒரு பெரிய கேள்விக் குறியாகவே உள்ளது. இவ்வளவு பிரச்சினைகளையும் சமாளிக்க ஒரே வழி நதிகளை இணைப்பது ஒன்றேயாகும். பெய்யும் நீரை சேமித்து வைக்கவும் பல திட்டங்கள் தீட்ட வேண்டும்.

### தமிழக நதிகள் இணைப்பு:

இனி தமிழகத்தில் உள்ள நதிகளை இணைப்பதைக் குறித்து இப்போது பார்ப்போம். ஆறுகள் முழுவதுமே தமிழக நீர்வழிப்பாதையுடன் இணைக்க வேண்டும். இந்த திட்டத்தை ஐந்து கட்டங்களாக நிறைவேற்றலாம்.

முதல் கட்டத்தில் 350 கி.மீ நீளத்தில் மேட்டுரையும், வைகையையும் இணைக்கலாம். இரண்டாம் கட்டத்தில் 270 கி.மீ தூரத்திற்கு மேட்டுரையும், பாலாறையும் இணைக்கலாம். மூன்றாம் கட்டத்தில் 130 கி.மீ நீளத்தில் பாலாறையும், தாமிரபரணியையும் இணைக்கலாம். நான்காம் கட்டத்தில் தாமிரபரணியையும், பெருஞ்சாணையையும் இணைக்கலாம். ஐந்தாம் கட்டத்தில் சம ஆறுகள் அனைத்தையும் ஒன்றாக இணைக்கலாம். இத்திட்டத்தின் மூலம் பெரும் பாலான நதிகளை இணைக்கலாம். இத்திட்டத்தின் நோக்கம் ஒரு நிலை படுத்துவது மட்டுமன்றி உபரி நீரையும் சேமிக்கலாம்.

### திட்டம்:

மூன்று நதிவழி திட்டத்தின் மூலம் ஒன்றன் பின் ஒன்றாக நதிகளை இணைக்கலாம்.

1. இமயமலை நீர் வழி: இது 4500 கி.மீ நீளம் கொண்டது. இதன் மூலம் கங்கை, காவிரி, தபதி முதலிய நதிகளை இணைக்கலாம்.
2. மத்திய நீர்வழி: இது 4650 கி.மீ நீளம் கொண்டது. இதன் மூலம் கிருஷ்ணா, கோதாவரி மற்றும் கேரள நதிகளை இணைக்கலாம்.
3. தென்னக நீர்வழி: இது 4650 கி.மீ நீளம் உள்ளது. இதன் மூலம் கிருஷ்ணா, கோதாவரி மற்றும் கேரள நதிகளை இணைக்கமுடியும். மற்றும் இவ்வாறு இணைக்கும் போது 120 மீட்டர் அகலமும் கொண்டு கால்வாய் அமைத்தால் மிகுதியாகத் தண்ணீரைச் சேமிக்க முடியும்.

### நதிநீர் இணைப்பை சாதித்துக் காட்டிய ஆந்திரா:

ஆந்திரா முதல்வர் சந்திர பாபு நாயுடு நதிநீர் இணைக்கும் திட்டத்தை அமுல்படுத்தினார்.

கடந்த ஜனவரி 1 ஆம் தேதி நதிநீர் இணைப்புச் சட்டத்தின் கீழ் அறிக்கை விடுத்தார். மார்ச் 9 ஆம் தேதி இத்திட்டத்திற்கான பணிகள் தொடங்கி ஆகஸ்டு 15 ஆம் தேதி நிறைவடைந்த இத்திட்டத்தை சந்திர பாபு நாயுடு விஜயவாடாவில் தொடங்கி வைத்தார். இத்திட்டம் 5 மாதம் 15 நாட்களில் முடிவடைந்தது. இத்திட்டம் மிக குறுகிய காலத்தில் தொடங்கி முடிக்கப்பட்டது.

கோதாவரியில் இருந்து தண்ணீர் கொண்டு வரப்பட்டு மேற்கு கோதாவரியின் வழியாக உள்ள பட்சிமா கிராமத்தின் வழியாக கிருஷ்ணா இணையும் படி திட்டம் தீட்டப்பட்டிருந்தது. இத்திட்டத்திற்கு 174 கிலோ மீட்டர் தூரம் வாய்க்கால் வெட்டப்பட்டது. இத்திட்டத்தின் கீழ் 17 லட்சம் ஏக்கர் விவசாய நிலங்கள் பயனடைகின்றன.

### நன்மைகள்:

வெள்ள நிவாரணப் பணிக்கு வழங்கும் பணத்தைச் சேமிக்கலாம். இதன் மூலம் வருவாய் அதிகரிக்கும். 15 கோடி ஏக்கர் நிலத்திற்கு விவசாயம் செய்யலாம். நதிநீரை இணைப்பதன் மூலம் மற்றும் விவசாயம் பெருகினால் 50 கோடி வரை ஏற்றுமதி செய்து முதலீட்டை எட்டலாம். அந்நிய செலவாணி அதிகரிக்கும்.

**INTERDEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES 2017-2018**

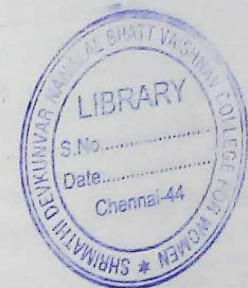

## DEPARTMENT OF HOME SCIENCE- CLINICAL NUTRITION AND DIETETICS & NUTRITION FOOD SERVICE MANAGEMENT AND DIETETICS

### GUEST LECTURE ON NUTRIGENETICS

A Guest lecture was conducted by the Department of Home Science on 23rd June 2017 at the SB Auditorium of our esteemed institution. This guest lecture was the first Association activity for the academic year 2017 – 2018, initiated with the support of management and our Madam Principal. The head of the department of Clinical Nutrition, Dr. Mrs. Renu Agarwal, inaugurated the lecture with her speech.

The chief guest was Mrs. Janani Tamilvanan, founder of Genobe wellness, a nutrigenetic expert. Her topic of speech was about the coming age of nutrigenetics. The main aim of the lecture was to impart awareness about the emerging field of nutrigenetics. Nutrigenetics aims to identify how genetic variation affects response to nutrients. This knowledge can be applied to optimize health, and prevent or treat diseases. The ultimate aim of nutrigenetics is to offer people personalized nutrition based on their genetic makeup.

Miss. Sarah Priscilla, Assistant Professor, felicitated the chief guest with a token of appreciation. The session came to an end with the felicitation speech of Mrs. Vijaya Vahini, Head, Department of Nutrition, Food Service Management and Dietetics. The guest lecture was thought provoking, interesting and inspiring to both students and staff.

### INTERVENTION PROGRAM FOR CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASES

On 4th October 2017, Wednesday, the Department of Home Science – Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics along with Nutrition, Food Service Management and Dietetics organized a one day seminar on the topic Intervention Program for Cardiovascular Diseases. This event was planned on account of the "World Heart Day" which is celebrated on 29th September every year across the world. The awareness cum intervention program on cardiovascular diseases and its risk factors were well-received by the audience.

The program was inaugurated around 9:30AM in an enchanting environment. The inauguration ceremony was presided by our beloved principal Dr. V. Varalakshmi and our vice principals of both day and evening college along with the gracious presence of eminent chief guests Prof. Dr. V. Chockalingam and Dr. Priya Chockalingam. All the sessions took place in the mini auditorium.

The program had four sessions. The first session was on the topic "Cardiovascular disease prevention - An overview" by Dr. Priya Chockalingam, General Physician, Founder and Clinical Director at Cardiac Wellness Institute, Chennai. In her speech she enlightened the risk factors that cause cardiovascular diseases and other non-communicable diseases in young people. The importance of exercise and physical activities were also emphasized.

The second session for the day was delivered by Dr. Sheeba Sangeetha Jeyaraj, Assistant Prof., Department of Home Science, Women's Christian College, Chennai on nutrition and lifestyle challenges towards developing a healthy heart. Her speech gave us a clear knowledge about the disease prevalence rate in our country and possible preventive measures to lead a healthy life. Importance of practising good dietary habits was highlighted.

The third session enthusiastically started around 1:00 p.m. by our respectable chief guest Prof. Dr. V. Chockalingam, Emeritus Cardiology, Dr. MGR Medical University, Guindy, Chennai on the topic "Mind your heart: Heart attack prevention and cure by positive lifestyle" - positive thinking; healthy eating and adequate exercise were strategies useful for the delegates to bring about a positive outlook towards a healthy life. His speech provided practical insights on lifestyle management for cardiac diseases.

The concluding session was addressed by Dr. Dharini Krishnan, Consultant Dietician. She emphasized on the changed dietary guidelines provided by the American Heart Association (AHA) and highlighted that cholesterol is no longer a contributing factor for heart diseases. The Valedictory Session was presided by the beloved Principal Dr. V. Varalakshmi and the Vice Principal Dr. Victoria Priscilla. All the sessions on the whole were informative, interactive and inspiring.

### **INDUSTRIAL VISITS ORGANIZED IN THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2017-2018**

#### **ONE DAY DAIRY VISIT TO AAVIN - SHOLINGANALLUR**

The students of the Department of Home Science visited the Aavin dairy factory on 5th August 2017. Sixty students of the department had participated in the visit. This dairy unit is located at Sholinganallur on Old Mammallapuram Road (Rajiv Gandhi Salai), at an area of 32.99 acres. Aavin is the trademark of Tamil Nadu Co-operative Milk Producers' Federation Limited, a Tamil Nadu-based milk producer's union.

The students saw the procurement and processing of milk and milk products. The purpose of homogenizing and pasteurizing unit was explained. Students saw the refrigeration unit, high speed packaging machines and effluent treatment plant. Quality standards are maintained by practicing hygienic handling methods. The different varieties of milk processed at Sholinganallur include: Pasteurized Toned Milk, Standardized milk, Full cream milk, Double toned milk. The visit proved to be informative on the whole.

#### **LONDON BAKERY INDUSTRIAL VISIT**

The Department of Home Science had organized an industrial visit to London Bakery situated in Subramaniam Salai, Kottivakkam, Chennai, on Saturday, 23rd September 2017. The purpose of the visit was to provide an opportunity to the students to witness the various production and manufacturing practices that occur in the bakery and confectionery industry. London Bakery established in the year 2014 had gained a valuable customer base with their expertise and quality production practices. Students observed the production of bread, bun, cookies and cutlets and had learnt the icing process for cakes. Students also visited the storage areas of the bakery and deciphered the different modes of storage for various perishable and non-perishable food ingredients.

#### **REGIONAL WORKSHOP ON "HOSPITAL DIETETICS- ROLE OF NUTRITION IN PATIENT CARE"**

The students of Department of Home Science attended a regional workshop organized by Christian Medical College, Vellore on 3rd February 2018. Thirty five students of the Department had participated in the workshop on "Hospital Dietetics- Role of Nutrition in Patient Care".

The first session was presided by Dr. Sara Mathai, Professor, Paediatric Endocrinologist, CMC, Vellore. In her speech on the topic "Role of Dietician in child nutrition", she had discussed about various aspects of child growth, malnutrition and the importance of a healthy diet in alleviating the complications.

The next session was followed by Dr. Meenakshi Bajaj, Chief Dietician in Tamil Nadu Multi Super Speciality Hospital, Chennai. She had addressed the topic of "Recent trends in Nutrition Therapy in Managing Diabetes". The effectiveness of medical nutrition therapy for managing diabetes was emphasized. Dr. Subramani, Prof. & Head of Critical Care Division, CMC, Vellore presented his lecture on the "Role of nutrition in hospitalized critical care patients". He stressed the importance of nutrition in critically ill patients.

The fourth session for the day was addressed by Ms. Merina Alex- Chief Dietician, MMM Hospital, Chennai. Her topic emphasized the importance of "Recent guidelines for nutrition care in renal diseases". The different renal diseases and goals of nutrition therapy for chronic kidney disease were presented.

An interactive session on the roles and responsibilities of a dietician was presented by Prof. Dr. Deivasigamani Revathi, Head of the Clinical Nutrition and Dietetics department, Muthurangam Arts College, Vellore. The next

session was addressed by Ms. Manimegalai, Chief Dietician, CMC, Vellore on "Novelty Diets", like the Paleo, Vegan, Detox, and Keto diets.

The topic of "Eating disorders", was addressed by Ms. Anitha.M, Dietitian, CMC, Vellore. The session was followed by the topic "Dietary Formulations" by Ms. Jayalakshmi, Dietitian, CMC, Vellore. She had explained the formulation of special feeds. The concluding session was a practical session that dealt with calculation and fixing of calorie and protein for the given case study.

#### **A VISIT TO RADHA REGENT**

An industrial visit to Hotel Radha Regent for the final year students of the Department of Home Science was organized on 9th February 2018. The hotel is a certified 3-star hotel. Radha Regent, located at Arumbakkam, Chennai has three multi-cuisine restaurants and one bar that includes the lobby café, the orient blossom, Geoffrey's pub and aura, the lounge bar. There are six banquet halls with a total space of 6500 square feet. The manager of the hotel Mr. Arun Kumar, explained the operational hierarchy. Students were given the opportunity to view the different glass wares, cutleries and crockery. They had also demonstrated the different napkin folding techniques like diamond, rose, pyramid, candle and arrow folding. They had also showed the different ways to set a table.

Students were taken in batches to visit the kitchen and storage area. The working of the different equipment like bain-marie, deep freezers, and rangers were explained. Students visited the butchery and vegetable cutting area. There are separate areas for preparing tandoori, Chinese and continental dishes. At one end of the kitchen, dishwashing area was located.

In the storage area, the procurement and storage procedures were elaborated by the staff. The method of receiving the goods and checking for their quality was also explained. The visit proved to be a great opportunity to gain practical knowledge about the styles of service and the equipments used in the hotel. The students thus gained a comprehensive insight in the field of food service.

#### **INDUSTRIAL VISIT TO SUGAR MILL**

The students of the Department of Home Science visited the Madhuranthagam Co-Operative Sugar Factory, Padalam, Chengalpet on Friday, 23rd February 2018. Eighty five students from the department had participated in the visit. They were provided with the thorough knowledge of the manufacturing, processing and production of sugar.

Students were given the knowledge of the entire processes taking place in converting the raw material (sugarcane) into a complete product (sugar). The sugarcane that were used in the processing were organically grown in their own farms. Vermicompost and bio-degradable composts were used as fertilizers. With the help of the machineries, the juices were extracted. The by products of sugarcane processing were transported to small scale industries for fuel. The raw juice was processed to get crystallized sugar. These were then packaged and transported to different parts of the state.

#### **EXTENSION ACTIVITY**

##### **VISIT TO PRE-SCHOOL**

A field visit to the pre-school, Achariya Bala Siksha Mandir, Chromepet was organized by the Department of Home science for the final year students. The field visit was planned from 10/10/2017 to 13/10/2017. Each day was planned to cover various developmental aspects such as moral, emotional, physical, motor and socio developments. For the purpose of assessing their abilities and levels of development, activities were given. At the end of the visit, a good rapport was developed between the student and kids.

Anthropometric measurements of the children were recorded to assess their physical development and motor development. For the purpose of observing creative development in children, they were given colouring materials. Cognitive development was also analyzed. Interactive sessions were organized to develop language and emotional development. The festival of lights had helped study the social development in kids. Concepts of sharing and greeting were inculcated as a part of moral development.

A team of 12 doctors and 12 paramedical staff visited SDNB Vaishnav College for women and have screened the Second and Third year students on 13th, 14th, 15th and 16th September, 2017 in our college premises.

According to their opinion a majority of the student population had the following Medical conditions:

- Refractive Error
- Underweight
- Nutritional Deficiency (Anaemia, Vitamin Deficiency)
- Dental Caries

On a case to case basis the Doctors have given due Medical prescriptions to the concerned students and students have benefited accordingly.

#### HEALTH CAMP FOR STAFF

On behalf of Apollo Shine Foundation, a team of 4 doctors and 21 paramedical staff visited SDNB Vaishnav College for women, and have screened the staff on 8th and 9th December 2017 in our college premises.

According to their opinion, majority of the teaching and non-teaching staff had the following medical conditions:

- Obese
- Ostopenia and Osteoporosis
- Malocclusion
- Dental Caries
- Refractive error

On a case to case basis, the doctors have given medical prescription to the concerned staff. Doctors suggested increasing calcium foods and supplementing intake for Ostopenia and Osteoporosis.

#### APOLLO SHINE – STUDENT AWARENESS PROGRAM

##### DAY 1

The Apollo Shine conducted an awareness program on First Aid and Basic Life Support on the 19th of March 2018 at 11:30 AM. Mr. Jeeva, Emergency staff of the Paramedic Unit of the Apollo Hospitals gave an awareness talk on the importance of First Aid and how to sustain basic life support in emergencies. He spoke about how to react when there is an accident, and how to save the victim without the help of any medical equipments or doctors. The students found this to be a thought provoking session and had the complete awareness on how to sustain basic life support during emergency.

##### DAY 2

The Apollo Shine of SDNB Vaishnav College for Women conducted an awareness program on Anaemia on 23rd March 2018 at 11:30 AM. Dr.V.Saranya, Consultant Oral Pathologist at the Apollo White Dental delivered the awareness talk on Anaemia. Anaemia is said to be one of the most underdiagnosed condition among humans, which could further implicate to cardiovascular diseases. Hence in order to spread awareness about this condition Dr.Saranya discussed about the basic information regarding the human physiology which must be taken care of in order to prevent anaemia. She spoke about the physiological changes that happen to a person's body when the person is experiencing anaemia and how to improve iron content through food to prevent anemia.

##### DAY 3

The members of the unit of Apollo Shine of SDNB Vaishnav College for Women conducted an one-day awareness program on Cancer on 24th March 2018 at 12:00 PM. The program commenced with the address of the day's speaker, Dr. Nihanthy Sreenath, MBBS, DMRT, DNB, Radiology Oncologist at Apollo Cancer Institute. The students were given the knowledge about the different types of cancer and the way they can be diagnosed. She spread an awareness regarding the relationship between cancer and media which acts as a social taboo and regarding the various myths related to cancer. The students found this as a thought provoking session and had a complete knowledge about cancer.

## REPORT ON APOLLO SHINE - AWARENESS PROGRAM

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## 27 CONSTELLATIONS OF VEDIC ASTRONOMY

### INTRODUCTION

We have many eminent astronomers in times of Rigveda, notably, Atri, SunahsepaRishi, Hiranyastupa Rishi, Kutsa Rishi, Uchathya and his son Dirghatmas, his son Kaksivat and his daughter Rishika Ghosa. They observed the circular orbits of those stars which were always visible, and their revolution about one and the same center must have led them to the idea and analogy of a self-rotational motion of a wheel. Vedic Rishis were able to differentiate between stars and planets, as stars remain relatively fixed over the centuries while planets moved substantial distance during a comparatively short time. Vedic Rishis, among them most prominent, Dirghatamas observed the regular patterns of the motions of visible celestial objects, especially the Sun, Moon, stars and near planets. He studied the changing position of the Sun along the horizon or the changing appearances of stars in the course of the year, which led him to establish an agricultural or ritual calendar. Many other Rishis used astronomical data for astrological prognostication. Dirghatamas described most of his astronomical observations in Asya Vamasya hymn containing fifty two verses. We have seen RV 1-164-48 is also one of the most unique verses of Asya Vamasya hymn. In this verse, Dirghatamas conceives a wheel of time called 'Samvatsara KalChakra' which consists of twelve fellies and 360 spokes referring to twelve months and 360 days. Let us recall the verse again.

"Twelve are the fellies, and the wheel is single; three are the naves. What man hath understood? Therein are set together spokes three hundred and sixty, which in nowise can be loosened." Sayanacharya says that twelve spokes refers to twelve lunar months which forms the basis of year called 'Samvatsara' a Sanskrit term for year. Dirghatamas discovered very early that the seasons are related to the position of the Sun in the sky at noon, which in turn is related to the northward and southward motion of the rising sun on the eastern horizon. Hence the two halves of the year namely Uttarayna and Dakshinayana, became the two basic divisions. The observance of Uttarayna and Dakshinayana indicated that year contains roughly 360 days or 720 pairs of ahas (days) and ratri (nights) together. The basic unit of a calendar is the day, the month and the year. Of these the year or the Samvatsara is the most important constituent. On the other hand, many scholars have taken twelve spokes to mean the twelve Zodiacs.

### TWENTY-SEVEN VEDIC NAKSHATRAS

The seventh Sukta of nineteenth kanda in Atharva veda, composed by Gargya Rishi describes twenty-seven Vedic Nakshatras. Using the astronomical time markers in this hymn, one can identify when the last of the Veda, Atharvaveda was composed.

The hymn AV19-7 reads as follows:

### TRANSLITERATION

The hymn illustrates both astronomical and astrological elements. Twenty eight Nakshatras begins with 'Krittika' and refers to 'Ayanam' occurring in Maghad. RishiGargya shows nakshatraAbhijit' between 'Uttarashadha' and 'Shravana'. Its use has been suspended in the astrology with only twenty seven identified currently. The hymn forms the basis of the Hindu calendar that uses a system of 27 or 28 Nakshatras (lunar constellations) to calculate a month. Each month can be divided into 30 lunar tithis (days). There are usually 360 or 366 days in a year. The additional name, Abhijit, making a total of 28 stars.) The genuineness of the Atharvaveda texts is beyond any doubt as hundreds of generations of have carried Vedas down to us in its original language using oral traditions of Krama, Pada, Jatha. So that distortions are nonexistent.

### DIVISION OF THE 27 NAKSHATRAS

Nakshatra or Constellation is a combination of two words – Naks meaning sky and Shetra meaning region or an area. A Nakshatra is a region or area of the sky. The Ancient Sages divided the zodiac (apart from twelve signs) into 27 Nakshatras or constellations of 13.20 degrees each. A Nakshatra is also called as lunar mansion or constellation. Its reference is found in the ancient Vedic scriptures. As per the Hindu mythology, all the twenty seven Nakshatras are the daughters of king Daksha and Moon is married to all of them and the Moon spends approximately one day each in one constellation and thus lunar month is of approximately of 27 days equal to the numbers of Nakshatras. Nakshatras are classified as per several attributes like its owner, deity, sex, caste, species etc. The Nakshatra, in which one's Moon is placed at the time of birth, is called Janma Nakshatra or the birth star. These Nakshatras are further subdivided into four quarters known as Pada, each spanning 3.20 degrees,

known as Navamsa. The placement of planets in these padas or subdivisions is studied for finer predictions. Each zodiac sign covers nine Padas in total. Thus we can see that Nakshatras are used for various purposes and one of its major uses is to determine starting point of a dasha or planetary period or cycles that divide the time in major periods and sub periods and to choosing a muhurtha or auspicious time for any important activity. As per with their qualities, the 27 constellations are divided into following categories and are favorable muhurtha for:

- Sthira or Fixed
- Ugra or Fierce
- Mridu or Tender
- Misra or Mixed
- Chara or Movable
- Kshipra or Swift
- Tikshna or sharp

The Sthira or Fixed nakshatras are Rohini, Uttara Phalguni, Uttara Ashadha, and UttaraBhadrapada. These constellations are favorable for any work of fixed, stability and long term purpose like planting trees, purchasing property, laying the foundations for buildings, construction of home, factory etc. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Sunday.

The Chara or Movable nakshatras are Punarvasu, Swati, Shrivana, Dhanishtha, and Shatabhisha. These constellations are favorable for buying automobiles, vehicles, gardening, going on journey and travel. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Monday.

The Ugra or Fierce nakshatras are Bharani, Magha, PurvaPhalguni, PurvaAshadha, and PurvaBhadrapada. These constellations are favorable for destructive deeds such as demolishing any structure, setting fires, making imprisonment and works that require force, weapons and confronting enemies. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Tuesday.

The Kshipra or Swift nakshatras are Ashwini, Pushya and Hasta. These constellations are favorable for trade and commercial transactions, admission in school or college, using medicine, taking or giving loans, journey and travel. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Thursday.

The Mridu or Tender nakshatras are Mrigashira, Chitra, Anuradha, and Revati. These constellations are favorable for making new friends and enjoyment of pleasures, romance, dance, drama, fashionable clothes, writing of poetry. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Friday.

The Tikshna or Sharp nakshatras are Ardra, Ashlesha, Jyeshtha, and Mula. These constellations are favorable for filing for a divorce, black magic, casting spells, exorcism, punishment, hypnotism, evoking of spirits, goblins, demons etc. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Saturday.

The Misra or mixed nakshatras are Krittika and Vishakha. These constellations are favorable for activities like worshipping, fire ceremonies, purchasing furniture and electronics. This will be more auspicious if these nakshatras happen to fall on Wednesday.

### CONCLUSION

The use of lunar asterisms in astronomy and astrology is evident not only in India but also in China, Persia, Greece, and Egypt. They were named manzils, by Islamic astronomers. Arabic verses in which weather lore is related to the full Moon in a given manzil reflect a similar usage of the manzils by the Muslims to that of the nakshatras by the Hindus, although in Indian culture it was especially the ceremonial aspect of the nakshatras, with each nakshatra being sacred to some deity that was important. The definition confirms well with the stellar determinants of the nakshatras, and with the stellar determinants of the corresponding manzils. In ancient times stars helped people navigate through darkness and across the seas. Hence any idea, thought, concept, prayer, chant, path or doctrine that leads to liberation across the ocean of transmigration is called taraka, the leading star. Stars also play an important role in the destiny of an individual. Depending upon the position of the stars at the time of birth, a person's fate is predetermined. Therefore the position of stars and their association with planetary gods help Vedic astrologers determine the fate of individual and predict future events. Knowledge of stars helped ancient Indian seafarers to navigate the seas and trade with people in distant lands. Stars and their location provide direction and guidance

to people, who have lost their way or caught in the darkness of life. Hence, in Hindu symbolism they are often equated with seers and spiritual teachers. Some stars are believed to be the souls of ancient seers, Gods and celestial beings.

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## VEDIC THERMODYNAMICS

### INTRODUCTION:

Everything that happens or we do is connected to energy in one form or another. The use of energy is as old as the history of the mankind. Ancient man was not concerned with the nature of the phenomena and was ignorant of the notion itself but had been making use of what is now called energy for thousands of years. The word energy consists of two Latin words energy and ergon, energy means 'in' and 'ergon' means work. The concept of Energy is one of the most peculiar in all of physics. Physics defines energy as capacity to do work but this is rather a superficial explanation facilitated to fit their theoretical framework. In Vedic thought also, the powers of nature and their effects: the sunrise and sunset, beauty of moon, starry nights, colorful clouds, beautiful colors and butterflies and peacock, sweetness in fruits and beauty in flowers – all are representative of different forms of energy and their different patterns. "Energy is an abstract concept invented by physical scientists in the nineteenth century to describe quantitatively a wide variety of natural phenomena." Energy seems to be like 'Brahma', unknowable and indescribable, but we can realize it.

### FOUNDATIONS OF VEDIC ENERGY SCIENCE:

According to philosophy as well as science, energy is the primordial form of the universe which provides the driving force of life and universe. The present book attempts to widen the range of thought by unfolding a border philosophy of the energies of nature, as suggested by Vedic hymns that describe various natural forces defined as Devas.

Through media, magazines and books, scientists persuade public to follow and propagate their false energy doctrines. They frighten the world by teaching demonic concept of "entropy" that implies that someday existence would turn into chaos due to unavailability of energy. They undermine power of God by telling that someday disorder will prevail over order. They, thus, abuse the whole kingdom of God and his arts. They forget the words of Allah and Jesus that something can come out from nothing (Ex nihilo) and there is no want of power in the kingdom of God. They equally forget the "Law of reversal of Entropy" that Lord Krishna preached to Arjuna in the battlefield of Kurukshetra.

### STUDY OF VEDIC HYMNS LEADS US TO FRAME VARIOUS POSTULATES OF VEDIC THERMODYNAMICS AS FOLLOWS:

• Energy is one. We may call it by different names. Vedanta calls it as Brahma. Deva Ramananda calls it as Zero Energy. Zero energy (consciousness) > Cosmic energy = Matter + perpetual motion, ordered and disordered. He says: "Zero energy is the highest, infinite, attributeless, unconditioned, potential, without the name and form, transcendental, beyond space and time, beyond causality and the world, eternal, has no beginning and no end, beyond creation, conservation, and destruction, mother of manifested energy, existence, consciousness or bliss, object of meditation, represents unity, changes do not effect it, it has no dualism, where as the 'Cosmic energy' is lower, finite, attributed, conditioned, kinetic, with name and forms, immanent, forms time and space continuum, shows cause and effect relationship, created, conserved, and destroyed. Daughter of ultimate energy, Manifest energy, many faceted energy, represents plurality, active, changes do affect.

The operation of universe is parallel to the self – moving wheel rotating on a fixed axis as described by sage Dirghatamas, in other words, the universe is in state of perpetual motion and it has an axis. It is not isotropic and has a preferred direction dictated by gravity which is a creative and most intelligent force. Because of dual nature of gravity, universe is subjected to expansion and contraction also. They are called in Sanskrit as Vikasha and Sankocha, which means expanding and shrinking. "The whole universe, as it were, shrinks, and then it expands again."

- The annihilation of the Universe is largely governed by Agni (heat) by increasing disorder, while the creation of Universe is largely governed by Indra (gravity) by increasing order. Agni is entropy increasing deva; on the other hand, gravity in the form of Indra is entropy reducing Deva.
- A large number of verses describe Indra's amazing ability to stretch and shrink matter in a technical manner which implies that the universe cannot expand without creating mass – energy and universe cannot contract without annihilating mass – energy. Thus, Universe is auto – geared in requirements of its energy as Lord Krishna also says in the Bhagavad Gita: " "O Arjun! When order declines and disorder increases, I (Brahma) create by my own nature to re - establish the order.
- Nature exhibits order that is governed by rta. This order is displayed by planetary and atomic perpetual motion, the seasons and cycles on earth etc. Rta defines an inflexible law of harmony and synergy which suggests a foundation for its comprehension through the mind. There are many beautiful forms of rta. The principle of order is sometimes represented by the pillar (skambha) as in the Atharvaveda and anthropomorphized as Brahmanaspati.
- From the highest to lowest, Agni (heat) exists in many forms. Natural forces have their natural birth and end in Agni.
- According to science, work is energy requiring and energy consuming process. According to Vedic energy science, work is not energy consuming process, contrarily work is energy augmenting process. In Vedas, we see Devas are doing different kinds of works and augmenting their energy. It is by doing works and perpetually increasing their energy that they keep on evolving. The laws of Agni (heat) govern all laws of nature, all evolutionary processes, and all forms and actions in the universe. In fact, we do not need to compare erroneous concepts of thermodynamics with Vedic energy science as we believe that all major concepts of thermodynamics have arisen out of impossibility of perpetual motion. With knowledge of existence of perpetual motion, they all vanish into nothing. It appears that even after their birth natural forces are not independent of Agni which is inherent in their nature which provides exchangeable medium for their movement to enable them to communicate to all region of universe. Hence, heat acts as an ambassador to rest of Gods (natural sources).
- All Natural forces are one in essence; basic nature of all natural forces is, more or less, same as they have originated from a single source.
- Natural forces are at different stages of evolution, hence, they also lead to evolution of the animals and plants or also through them they evolve.
- Natural Forces exhibit their higher and lower nature.
- Many Natural Forces exhibit their dual nature. E.g. light and gravity, they exist in particle and wave form.
- All Natural forces show their creative and destructive nature. However, some natural forces are more creative than destructive and vice versa.
- Natural forces are not subject to decay, they are inexhaustible because principle of Perpetual motion is inherent in their nature.
- Natural forces exhibit symmetry, harmony and synergy in their interrelationships .
- Natural forces possess intelligence in accordance with their stage of evolution. They communicate with each other.
- Natural forces exhibits correlation and coupling with other forces to perform special functions. Hence, we have one Indragni (Gravity + Agni) responsible for expansion and contraction of the universe. (cf the Big Bang and big crunch of Universe).

- Gravity is the most dominant force at macroscopic level and largely governs the cosmology of the Universe. It governs the structure and the stability of Universe. Besides, it performs hundreds types of works quickly hence, the name Shatakratu, Tuvikratu i.e quick performer of great works. He is also Tarvasi i.e. quick doer.
- Hymns related to Ashwins show that Electromagnetic force is most useful for domestic purposes. It is boon for medicine.
- Hymns related to Indra show that gravity is most suitable force for bulk power generation to perform hundreds types of work.
- The entire knowledge of Rigveda is available in the first letter, the first syllable, the first word, the first Richa (verse), the first Sukta (hymn) and the first Mandala (book of hymns) of Rigveda. At the end of this chapter, we will explore science of free energy in the first verse and first hymn of the Rigveda.

The above discoveries made by Rishis must have required much time and imagination, and above all a great ability for abstract thinking.

In addition, in order to get the secret knowledge of Energy Science and technology from Vedas, we are required to look into the following important subjects dealt in great lengths in Vedas:

1. The descriptions of the wheel and axle, importance given to them as found in the large number of verses devoted to wheel and axle.
2. Investigations into Secret Language employed in the descriptions of the wheels.
3. Structure of perpetual motion wheels described by Vedic Rishis.
4. The exploration of mechanical science – analysis of metaphors related to Wheel and Axle, different designs of flying aerial vehicles, the mechanical machines, similar to airplanes and flying with like a bird and very complex machines that cannot be precisely classified, which had unlimited possibilities.
5. The studies into Vedic Science of Yajna, architectural aspects of Yajna and science of heat and sound.
6. Deriving the Worldview from Vedas: In the end, we will study the emerging worldwide based on cyclical perpetual motion and Vedic thermodynamics.

Keeping above key points in mind, basic features, principles related to Energy Science have been elucidated with support from a large number of Vedic verses and an attempt has been made to develop a theory of alternative thermodynamics called as Vedic thermodynamics.

#### CONCLUSION:

To conclude, through hymns of Rigveda, a different theory of thermodynamics has been formulated in a great part. In fact, Vedic theory of Energy Science present axioms-principle, "Hypotheses" only. By adhering to all, the principle of sufficient reason, evidence of perpetual motion in Vedas and experimental data furnished by gravity wheel invented by Orffyreus, a new Energy Science is presented. Since theory is also directly based on experimental proof of perpetual motion, the classical conservation laws are at once violated. No doubt gravity motor has great theoretical, practical and heuristic value, it is unfortunate that scientist considered Orffyreus' wonderful gravity wheel as a folly or fraud without any practical and theoretical value. We are depending blindly too much on the western science, also we are forgetting our own heritage that rests on foundations of Dharma (Truths). Vedas really contain eternal truths that promise to put us ahead of science and can transform lives of people.

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#### INTRODUCTION:

The entire system of values is imparted through the concepts of punya (merit) and papa (sin). A subhasita defines these two terms in a succinct manner.

श्रोत्रं श्रुतेनैव न कुण्डलेन दानेन पाणिर्नतु कङ्कणेन ।  
विभाति कायः खलु सज्जनानां परोपकारेण न चन्दनेन ॥

The ear shines only by learning and not by earrings, the hand, by alms and not by bracelet; the body of noble men shines by helping others but not by applying sandal paste.

न चोरहार्यं न च राजहार्यं न भ्रातृभाज्यं न च भारकारि ।  
व्यये कृते वर्धत एव नित्यं विद्याधनं सर्वधनप्रधानम् ॥

The wealth of education is the best of wealth since it cannot be stolen by thieves; it cannot be carried away by kings; it cannot be divided among brothers as a matter of right; it is never a source of burden; when it is spent it grows all the more.

### CONCLUSION :

Wealth should be spent for others, education for righteous deeds, words for helping others and thoughts for ultimate emancipation.

### VEDIC MATHEMATICS

Vedic Mathematics is the name given to a supposedly ancient system of calculation which was "rediscovered" from the Vedas between 1911 and 1918 by Sri Bharati Krishna Tirthaji Maharaj (1884-1960). According to Tirthaji, all of Vedic mathematics is based on sixteen Sutras, or word-formulae. For example, "Vertically and Crosswise" is one of these Sutras. These formulae are intended to describe the way the mind naturally works, and are therefore supposed to be a great help in directing the student to the appropriate method of solution. None of these sutras has ever been found in Vedic literature, nor are its methods consistent with known mathematical knowledge from the Vedic era.

यावदुनं तावदूनीकृत्य वर्गं च योजयेत् ।  
युक्तियुतं वचो ग्राह्यं बालादपि शुकादपि ।  
युक्तिहीनं वचस्त्याज्यं वृद्धादपि शुकादपि ॥

Whatever is consistent with right reasoning should be accepted, even though it comes from a boy or even from a parrot; and whatever is inconsistent therewith ought to be rejected, although emanating from an old man or even from the great sage Sri Sukahimself. In other words, we are called upon to enter on such a scientific quest as this, by divesting our minds of all pre-conceived notions, keeping our minds ever open and, in all humility (as humility alone behoves and befits the real seeker after truth), welcoming the light of knowledge from whatever direction it may be forthcoming. Nay, our scriptures go so far as to inculcate that even their expositions should be looked upon by us not as "teachings" or even as advice, guidance etc. but as acts of "thinking aloud" by a fellow student.

## DIVISIBILITY

All numbers are divisible by some numbers or the other. 1 is not divisible by any number so it is indivisible. The numbers which are divisible by themselves are called Prime numbers. All other numbers are called composite numbers.

### Divisibility by Prime Numbers :

To check if the given number is divisible by any prime number we use its ekadhika. We multiply the last digit of the number by its ekadhika and add it to the other digits prior to the last digit. We keep doing it till we reach a number that we already know is divisible by the given number. Ekadhika of any prime number can be calculated by multiplying a number that gives 9 in the units place, and then we take one more than the previous digit(s) of 9 of the answer, as the ekadhika of the number

$$\text{Ekadhika of } 7 = 7 \times 7 = 49, 4 \text{ (previous digit) } + 1 = 5$$

$$\text{Ekadhika of } 13 = 13 \times 3 = 39, 3 \text{ (previous digit) } + 1 = 4$$

$$\text{Ekadhika of } 19 = 19 \times 1 = 19, 1 \text{ (previous digit) } + 1 = 2$$

### COMPARISON OF VEDIC AND GENERAL MATHEMATICS:

#### Divisibility by 7:

In Vedic Maths: Now we use the ekadhika to find the divisibility by 7. The ekadhika of 7 is 5. We multiply the last digit of the number by its ekadhika and add it to the other digits prior to the last digit. We keep doing it till we reach a number that we already know is divisible by 7.

Normal Maths: Double the last digit and subtract it from the remaining leading truncated number. If the result is divisible by 7, then so was the original number. Apply this rule over and over again as necessary.

Example: Is 743693 divisible by 7?

Example: Is 743693 divisible by 7?

Ekadhika of 7 is 5

Twice of last digit is 6

Last digit is 3 so  $3 \times 5 = 15$ , we add this to 74369 = 74384

Subtracting the remaining leading truncated number is  $74369 - 6 = 74363$

Last digit now is 4 so  $4 \times 5 = 20$ ,  $7438 + 20 = 7458$

Last digit now is 8 so  $8 \times 5 = 40$ ,  $745 + 40 = 785$

Last digit now is 5 so  $5 \times 5 = 25$ ,  $78 + 25 = 103$

Last digit now is 3 so  $3 \times 5 = 15$ ,  $10 + 15 = 25$

25 is not divisible by 7 so 743693 is not divisible by 7.

On repeating the procedure again and again we reach 68 which is not divisible by 7. Therefore 743693 is not divisible by 7.

39 is divisible by 13 so 126594 is divisible by 13.

On repeating the procedure again and again we reach 39 which is divisible by 13. Therefore 126594 is divisible by 13.

We conclude that the divisibility can be done for all the prime numbers and the composite numbers too. We need to combine the divisibility factors of the composite numbers. For example: if a number should be divisible by 6 it must be divisible by 2 and 3 as its factors. We can also perform the division of polynomial by the method called Samuccaye.

## SunyamSamyaSamuccaye

The Sutra 'SunyamSamyasamuccaye' says the 'Samuccaya is the same, that Samuccaya is Zero' i.e., it should be equated to zero. The term 'Samuccaya' has several meanings under different contexts.

We interpret, 'Samuccaya' as a term which occurs as a common factor in all the terms concerned and proceed as follows.

Example 1 :  $5(x+1) = 3(x+1)$  No need to proceed in the usual procedure like

$$5x + 5 = 3x + 3$$

$$5x - 3x = 3 - 5 \quad 2x = -2 \text{ or } x = -2 : 2 = -1$$

Simply think of the contextual meaning of 'Samuccaya'

Now Samuccaya is

$$(x + 1) x + 1 = 0$$

$$\text{Gives } X = -1.$$

SunyamSamyaSamuccaye for Quadratic Equations

Now 'Samuccaya' sutra, tell us that, if other elements being equal, the sumtotal of the denominators of the L.H.S. and their total on the R.H.S. be the same, that total is zero.

Example :  $1/x-8 + 1/x-9 = 1/x-5 + 1/x-12$

According to Samuccaye,

$$D1 + D2 = x-8+x-9 = 2x-17 \text{ and}$$

$$D3 + D4 = x-5 + x-12 = 2x-17$$

$$\text{Now, } 2x-17 = 0$$

$$\text{Gives } 2x = 17$$

$$X = 17/2 \text{ or } 8 \frac{1}{2}.$$

Thus we can proceed this method for higher polynomials for better understanding and also easy in calculation.

### EXPERIENTIAL LEARNING IS THE WAY FORWARD FOR INDIAN EDUCATION

Until a decade or two ago, knowledge was delivered in a way, where the focus was mainly on the instructor. The pedagogue was the only source of information for students, who shared information through hour-long lectures and detailed textbooks. Today, we are in the midst of a digital transformation, where static classrooms are becoming a thing of the past. Education is evolving drastically to become more experiential with every passing day. Students are taken out in the real world to gain first-hand experience and identify lessons that can inspire them to pursue higher studies in the field that most appeals to them. In this type of learning, the instructor acts as a guide and helps students to bridge the gap between theory and practical learning.

#### Merits of Experiential Learning

Experiential learning allows students to develop critical-thinking, problem-solving and decision-making skills. In such an environment, students are free to experiment, try new things, learn in a safe and controlled atmosphere, and gain real-time feedback. This kind of learning helps students build an emotional connect with the subject, leverage real examples for inspiration and enhance their experiences in manner that leaves them with rich stories to share back with their friends and peers.

#### Lapse in Policymaking

While there are many experiential learning programs being promoted by schools and other educational institutions, there is an application vacuum, which the students experience. There is only a little focus on the purpose of experiential learning and students are unable to retain what they see and learn. Experiential learning should be able to incorporate techniques that encourage students to engage in their learning on a multi-sensory level. The sensory system has the ability to stimulate the cognitive function. For instance, the olfactory and gustatory systems provide strong sensations that remain connected to the information processed, whereas tactile learning promotes curiosity and boosts creativity amongst children. Experiential learning should fuel the brain in various ways so that each sensory system becomes more developed and supports higher functioning.

While technology has enabled the creation of manicured or simulated experiences inside studios for students, it is real-world experiences that can bring a level of nuance and detail that no simulation can match. Experiential learning through real-life experiences will promote critical thinking amongst students, enable them to reflect upon their decisions, take responsibility for their actions and get an understanding of how their actions make an impact in the society. In other words, experiential learning allows students to take control of their own learning. Students who learn in this collaborative manner tend to feel more engaged in their learning experience and self-assess themselves with the help of criteria and standards, write a reflection report about their learning experiences, and obtain feedback on their report from an expert/teacher colleague based on the same criteria and standards. Having a self-evaluation system rather than external certifications indicates the maturity of such programs.

#### The Implementation Plan

An effective experiential program with real-time experiences should trigger original thinking and enable students to come up with feasible solutions for the actual problems seen around them. They should be able to engage with real-world systems and think deeper about the purpose associated with them. Many a times the abstract teachings inside a classroom do not expose kids to the limitation of resources. Any number of mathematical models or simulations cannot teach them about the existing actual on-ground challenges. When they work within limitations they start understanding the need to conserve resources or be more productive with the help of limited resources. They learn to work in groups or brainstorm in a team. This method of learning boosts engagement levels and enables them to achieve their goals faster while communicating the importance of teamwork and being a team player. They understand the significance of effective communication, learn body language, effective listening, understand scripts, etc.

From the formative years, kids should be exposed to experiential learning. When they experience the real world first-hand, they are more likely to get inspired and have a sense of direction. As India grapples with pressing global and social issues, the experiential learning revolution will enable the country's future to tackle some of them and bring about positive changes in the society in tangible ways.

### One year on the Road of GST...

GST- a word which we came across most frequently in these recent months. Goods and Service Tax, as it was expanded, was an indirect tax levied in India on the supply of goods and services. Launched at the midnight on 1st July, 2017, it was marked as an historic midnight session of both the houses of Parliament.

One year has passed since the GST was introduced, we have to admit that it may not be the most perfect single tax system, but it was working. The issue of Inflation of Price for which were feared the GST, did not happen in India unlike with many countries that launched a single tax regime. Launching of the policy ONE NATION- ONE TAX was not an easy task, especially for a diverse country like India, we should really say that the Government planned and implemented the plans. It also accepted and rectified the mistakes.

The recent spike in consumer expense was only due to hike in food and fuel price, which was not related to GST. Same rate of tax from Kashmir to Kanyakumari, reduced the tension of taxpayers to follow 17 various laws, making the prices of goods and services stable with 11.2 million businesses registered under GST. It was higher than the previous registration number under old indirect tax which was 6.4 million, resulting in the expansion of tax base.

The increase of the service tax from 15% to 18% gave a negative impact. But the change was necessary to transform a developing country to a developed country. The tax system was not fully implemented; there were changes yet to come. The first year journey was one full of ups and downs with many positive and negative criticisms. The registration and revenues went up and multiple compliances for taxpayers went down. There would be a very long way to go for both the government and the taxpayer to attain a sustainable and regulated economic growth.

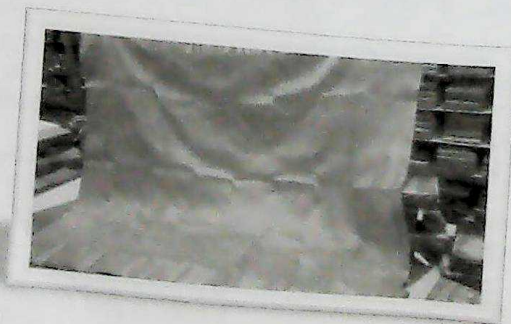
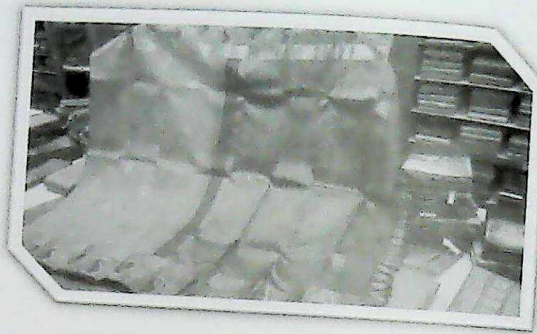

S-I-L-K: Threads of Tradition, silk is not just a protein fibre, it's an amalgam of traditional weaving methods, contemporary designs, motifs and colours. The fusion of silk and saree are the perfect combination of tradition and modernity.

Even though there are various types of silk sarees according to the tradition of each state, there are even varieties from within the state. Let's take the example of our state, apart from Kancheepuram sarees, THIRUBUVANAM sarees are also famous for their fan like folding (veesiri madipu) and SALEM silk for the innovations they bring on it. Though we get silk thread from the cocoon, those threads could be classified on the basis of three grades: first, second & third which makes the weavers to design the agmark graded saree. In recent times silk sarees does not only contain silk thread but a mix of POLYESTER also. The combination of COTTON+SILK renders the exact royal look rather than those of polyester which gives only weight to the saree trespassing its royalty. Moreover, the actual quality makes us feel the saree to be light enough to handle.

If you are an economics student, you would remember your economics teacher stressing one particular line in her demand analysis class; Demand in economics necessitates three things: desire to buy; willingness to buy; and purchasing power to pay. The second criteria – willingness, comes with the confidence of maintenance and knowledge upon the silk saree we own.

**CHECK OUT:** "If your Silk saree is genuine, it will have its body and border woven in separate sections. These sections are interlocked in a joint so strong that it does not detach even if the saree gets a tear."

The zari matters the most, both silver and gold. The rate you pay for a silk saree is not mainly for the cloth but for the high graded zari which has been weaved with. For cost efficiency purposes, many weavers have switched over to copper and bronze zari, but the exact supremacy lies with, the ever masteries



gold and silver zari. "Korvai" is when the border and pallu are woven separately and then into the body.

The fine weaving with the silver melted thread between body and border makes the joinery invisible. Even the authenticated retailers purchase silk saree based on the silver zari as their main criteria.

MASTER OF ALL THESE, THE WASHING OF THE SILK SAREE IS A TILL- DATE PUZZLE. Mix of REETHA POWDER (boondhi kottai available in naatumarundhu kadhai) ensures maintaining the exact texture rather than detergent. But it is must to wash a silk saree within that year of purchase for its lasting life.



The store place also matters. It is advisable to store in wooden cupboard than of steel ones. That too wrapping within a fine paper ensures good safety to the cloth. If not newspapers, the yellow cloth bags traditionally offered in wedding ceremonies is a better choice.

The final criteria, purchasing power; undoubtedly yes. It's a desire cum demand, how come not?! If not if you find any silk saree of your mother's with the above said zari qualities, those are the must outfit that must rest in your wardrobe too.

**HAVE A TEST** [if your mom allows] : "If you are very curious in knowing the silk you own is of top most quality, there is a small experiment for that too. Untie a small piece of silk thread from that you own. Burn it. If it results in ashes, there is no doubt you have the exact quality you expected. If the result is somewhat different from being a dark ash, you landed with a wrong decision."

"Pattu is not made of just threads, these are dreams of the weavers." So young ladies, find time to embrace yourself with the opulence of tradition. Also,

"Don't melt your old saris for their silver, You can use them to replicate the designs. The craft is irreplaceable."

### 1. KONARK SUN TEMPLE:

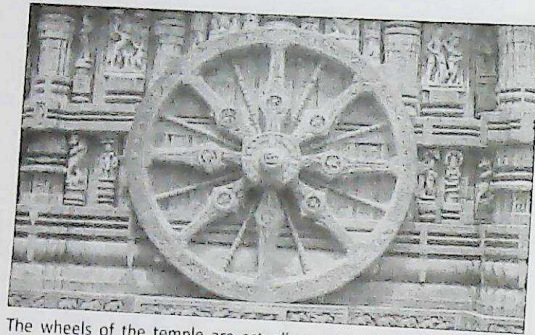


It is constructed in 1255 C.E. The temple is located in Konark, India. Temple is designed as a chariot with 24 wheels pulled by 7 horses.

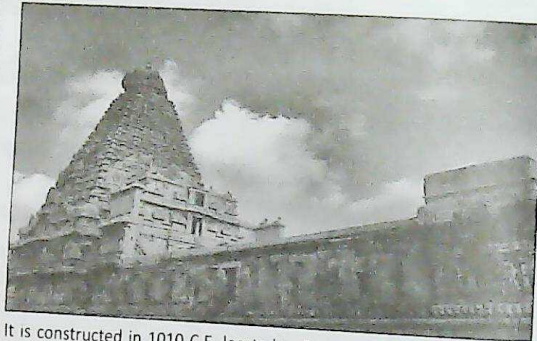


Part of the temple structure collapsed or was destroyed in the 17th century C.E. It is believed the collapsed structure had a 52-ton magnet at the top. This magnet caused the main statue (idol) to levitate in the air.

### 2. BRIHADESHWARA TEMPLE:



The wheels of the temple are actually sundials. Precise time can be calculated by the shadows cast by the spokes.

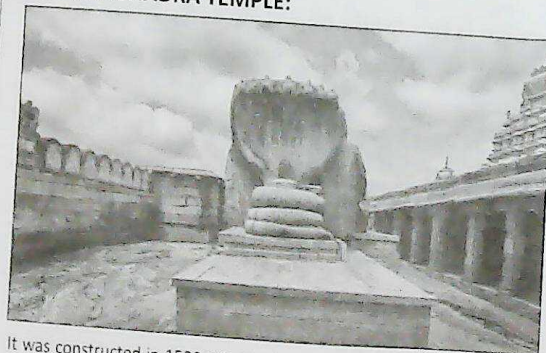


It is constructed in 1010 C.E., located in Tanjore, India. It is one of the largest temples in India. Approx. 130,000 tons of granite was used in the construction.

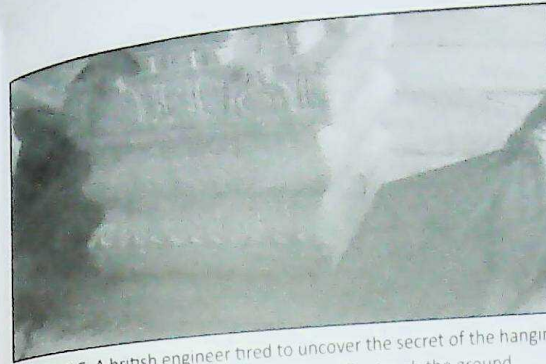
### 3. VEERABHADRA TEMPLE:



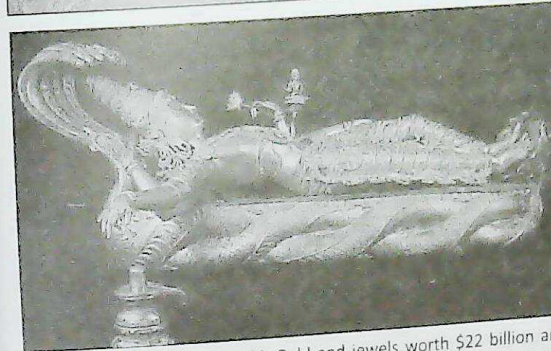
Kumbham (Round Apex Structure) is carved from a single granite rock. It weighs approx. 80 tons and sits on top of the temple tower. The Vimanam (Temple tower) is 66 meters (216 feet high). How did workers 1,000 years ago manage to lift an 80-ton carved stone this high... Without any cranes or lifting machines, still remains a mystery.



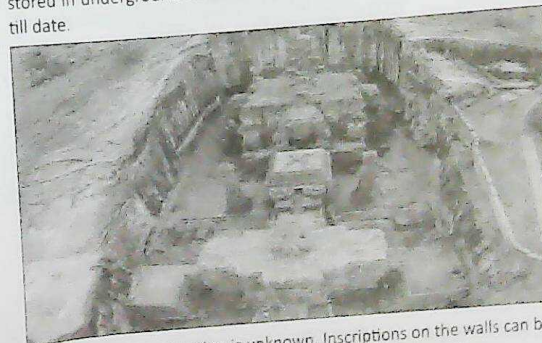
It was constructed in 1530 C.E. The temple is located in Lepakshi, India. The temple has around 70 pillars supporting the roof. However, one corner pillar in the hall does not rest on the ground.



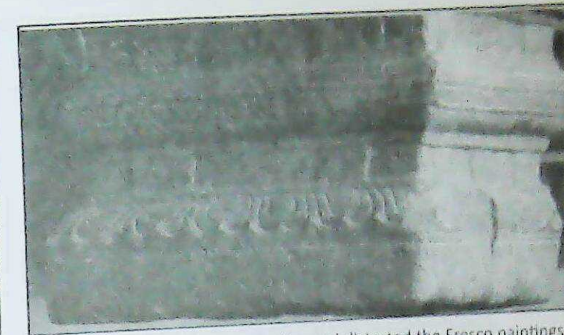
In 1910 C.E., a British engineer tried to uncover the secret of the hanging pillar. He managed to make a corner of the pillar touch the ground.



The richest temple in the world. Gold and jewels worth \$22 billion are stored in underground vaults. Only 5 out of 8 vaults have been opened till date.



Actual date of construction is unknown. Inscriptions on the walls can be traced to 8th century C.E. It is located in caves of Ellora, India.

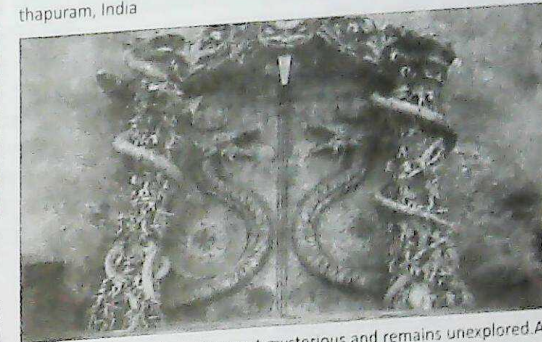

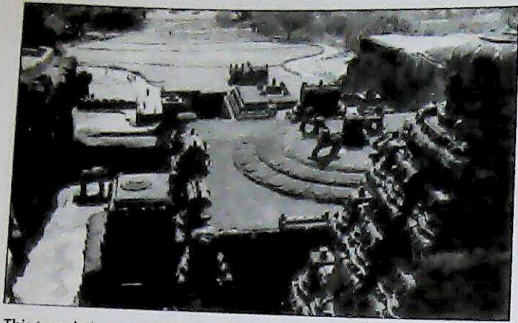
### 4. PADMANABHASWAMY TEMPLE:



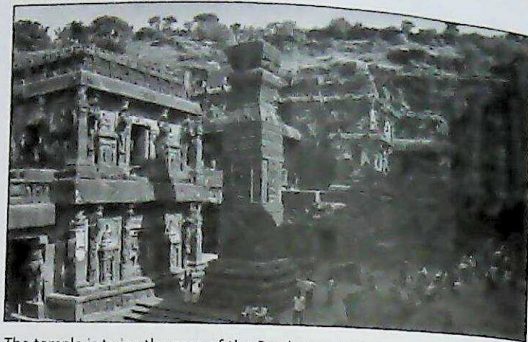
There is no exact date of origin of this temple. It is located in Thiruvananthapuram, India.



Vault B in the temple is the most mysterious and remains unexplored. A chamber in the vault is sealed with an enormous iron door. The door has two massive cobras painted on it with no means of entry. It is claimed that the door can only be opened by a mystic chant. It is believed that opening this chamber any other way would bring great misfortune.



This temple is a megalith – carved out of a single rock. It could only have been constructed by the vertical excavation method. Carvers started at the top of the rock and excavated downwards.



The temple is twice the area of the Parthenon in Greece and 50% taller. It has the largest cantilevered rock ceiling in the world.

Approximately 400,000 tons of rock had to be removed from the site.

How did workers, thousands of years ago, using only Hammers, Chisels manage to carve out this temples.  
Remains a mystery till date.....

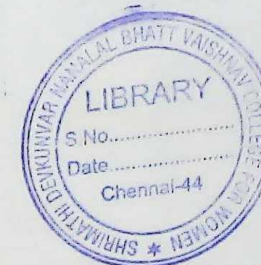
